Biden's Script Writers Prescribe Green Finance Genocide

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—The United States has, as of Wednesday January 27, 2021, officially entered into the process of Green Finance, the “Great Reset” launched by Prince Charles, former Bank of England Governor Mark Carney, BlackRock’s Larry Fink, and others, which is self-evidently a policy for mass depopulation of the human race, at home and abroad. The Executive Order signed by the faux president, Joe Biden, “Executive Order on Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad,” repeats several times, in different contexts, that the administration will “immediately begin to develop a climate finance plan, making strategic use of multilateral and bilateral channels and institutions, to assist developing countries in implementing ambitious emissions reduction measures, protecting critical ecosystems, building resilience against the impacts of climate change, and promoting the flow of capital toward climate-aligned investments and away from high-carbon investments.” This will in fact “assist developing countries” to give up any hope of escaping from poverty, while imposing a level of austerity in the midst of a pandemic and famine which will cause millions of deaths in the short term.

Most developing countries have grossly inadequate health systems. Most lack dependable electricity, even in the major cities, or have no electricity at all in large portions of their nations. The same is true for clean water. What little electricity they have is almost entirely from coal-fired power plants. Helga Zepp-LaRouche, the chairwoman of the Schiller Institute, has launched a “Committee for the Coincidence of Opposites” to mobilize the resources—the health community, the military, and the agricultural community—within the United States and other nations, to provide an adequate health capacity for all the nations on Earth, both for moral reasons and for the obvious fact that defeating the pandemic requires defeating it everywhere. It is also self-evident that to have such an adequate health capacity also requires access to uninterrupted electricity, clean water,

transportation, and other infrastructure. If the Executive Order prepared for Biden is implemented, none of this will be possible, and the dream of Prince Philip and his Malthusian son Charles for depopulating the Earth will be realized. It will also signal that the dream of the British Empire since the 18th century—to retake control of the upstart republic in the Americas—will have been finally accomplished.

Nor is this only a death sentence for poor countries—the Executive Order demands a “carbon pollution-free electricity sector no later than 2035” for the U.S. For those who imagine the U.S. economy and its population can survive on solar panels and windmills, prepare for blackouts, economic disintegration, and social instability which will make the Antifa/BLM rioting, arson, and looting last year, as well as the Jan. 6 attack on the United States Capitol, pale by comparison.

There is one big problem confronting the Malthusians, which has been identified by the new Secretary of State Antony Blinken, and by Britain’s self-appointed crusader against China, Nigel Farage, and others: China is building coal-fired plants—clean coal—both within China and all over the world, for the simple reason that, to transform poor nations into modern industrial states, as China has done in such a spectacular manner within its own borders, requires massive new infrastructure, which in turn requires exponential increases in electricity. While the Chinese are pursuing vast increases in nuclear power, and extensive research (with international cooperation) into the development of fusion power, they recognize that the human race must expand the use of fossil fuels in the meantime, to drive the world economy forward, to meet the vast needs of the world’s citizenry. The fake-science “Big Lie” that carbon, the food of our plant life, is overheating the Earth, repeated *ad nauseam* by Biden and his controllers, is widely believed, but with paper-thin understanding. As the devastating impact of the new fascist economy sinks in, and as both major political parties are in a state of dissolution, the serious members of the population will be looking for those who have been telling them the truth, and who know the required solutions.

Blinken Runs Hot and Cold in Comments on China and Yemen

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—Secretary of State [Antony Blinken](#) appeared at the daily State Department press briefing on Jan. 27 to schmooze with the press and make a few comments. In reply to a question on China, Blinken said that the U.S.-China relationship “was the most important relationship that we have in the world going forward. It’s going to shape a lot of the future.” He said it had “adversarial aspects” as well as “competitive aspects,” but also cooperative ones, “where it’s in our mutual interest to work together, including, manifestly, on climate, where it’s in the interest of China and the interest of the United States and the interest of countries around the world to make progress in combatting global warming. And so I think and hope that we’ll be able to pursue that.” Blinken’s words were appreciated, given the drumbeat of animosity that came out of Blinken’s predecessor Pompeo.

At the same time, Blinken said that he agreed with the determination of the Pompeo State Department that China was engaged in “genocide” in Xinjiang. One reporter commented that Linda Thomas-Greenfield, Biden’s pick for UN Ambassador, had said that the “genocide” designation was under review. Blinken said he hadn’t seen her remarks, so he couldn’t comment on that, but that he believed that it was genocide.

[Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian](#) responded to Blinken’s remarks on Jan. 28, simply stating: “There’s never ever such a thing as genocide in China. Period.

“Pompeo and his likes have concocted lies of the century about Xinjiang and slung mud at China’s Xinjiang policy. We never accept that. We have repeatedly refuted those rumors and stated the facts.

“Xinjiang has never been more prosperous than it is now, with unprecedented achievements in socio-economic development and improvement of people’s life. Residents in Xinjiang live a happy life in a stable environment. These facts are the best refutation to certain U.S. politicians’ anti-China remarks. No matter how hard those ill-intentioned individuals try to sow discord, they will not succeed in destabilizing Xinjiang or stopping Xinjiang’s endeavor for progress.”

Blinken also indicated that the Pompeo decision to designate the Houthis in Yemen as a foreign terrorist organization was also under review, and he also took Saudi Arabia to task for “contributing” to what is estimated to be “the worst humanitarian crisis in the world today.” Observing that the Houthis control territory that contains 80% of Yemen’s population, he said that the most important task was to get humanitarian aid to the people, “and so we want to make sure that any of these steps, including the designation [of terrorism], don’t make what is already an incredibly task even more difficult.”

China’s Ambassador Cui Tiankai Exhorts Washington To Cooperate with Beijing

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—Speaking yesterday at an online dialogue organized jointly by the Carter Center and the Chinese People’s Association for Peace and Disarmament, Chinese Ambassador [Cui Tiankai](#) remarked, “As we speak, COVID-19 continues to put human society to the test, and the China-U.S. relationship has come to a new crossroads. With the upcoming Year of the Ox bringing in confidence and hope, this dialogue is highly relevant and carries special significance.” Observing that Jan. 28 marked the 42nd anniversary of Deng Xiaoping’s visit to the United States, and that he and President Jimmy Carter “made the historic decision of establishing diplomatic relations between China and the United States.... Since then, our ever-deepening cooperation has delivered huge benefits to the two peoples,

and contributed enormously to world peace, stability and prosperity. ... At this historical juncture, we are facing a consequential choice again. I agree with President Carter that China and the United States must remain closely connected....

“It is our firm belief, that China and the United States can benefit from the prosperity and development of the other side. We can have competition, but we don’t have to be rivals. Instead, we should strive to be partners.... Taking China as a strategic rival and imaginary enemy would be a huge strategic misjudgment....

“Both China and the United States gain from cooperation and lose from confrontation. ... Over the past two decades, we have carried out effective coordination and cooperation in a wide range of fields, from overcoming the global financial crisis to fighting terrorism, from helping African countries combat Ebola to addressing hotspots such as the Korean Peninsula issue and the Iranian nuclear issue. It has been proved time and again that when China and the United States cooperate, we can get things done, and that is good news for both countries and the whole world.

“Right now, we face the common enemy of the pandemic and an increasing threat from climate change. China sincerely welcomes America’s return to the Paris Agreement and the World Health Organization and looks forward to stronger cooperation with it in these two fields. We also urgently need to enhance macroeconomic policy coordination to fend off international economic and financial risks and inject confidence into the world economy.”

The ambassador emphasized, “There is no place for McCarthyism in the 21st century, and no one can push the two peoples back to the era of estrangement and isolation.” Cui then quoted the poem recited by National Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman at Biden’s inauguration, and concluded: “Let’s work together, with courage and hope, to find light, spread light, and illuminate the future for China-U.S. relations and mankind.”

Homeland Security Department Warns of Domestic Terrorism Threat, from Your Neighbors

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—On the same day that President Joe Biden issued his executive order on climate change yesterday, Acting Homeland Security Secretary David Pekoske issued a [National Terrorism Advisory System Bulletin](#) “due to a heightened threat environment across the United States, which DHS believes will persist in the weeks following the successful Presidential Inauguration. Information suggests that some ideologically motivated violent extremists with objections to the exercise of governmental authority and the presidential transition, as well as other perceived grievances fueled by false narratives, could continue to mobilize to incite or commit violence.”

Beware the DVEs! The bulletin claims, “Throughout 2020, Domestic Violent Extremists (DVEs) targeted individuals with opposing views engaged in First Amendment-protected, non-violent protest activity [such as the Antifa and BLM riots and arson and looting!—ed]. DVEs motivated by a range of issues, including anger over COVID-19 restrictions, the 2020 election results, and police use of force have plotted and on occasion carried out attacks against government facilities.” It also cites what it called “Long-standing racial and ethnic tension—including opposition to immigration” and references a 2019 mass shooting in El Paso, Texas, in which 23 people were killed. “DHS is concerned these same drivers to violence will remain through early 2021 and some DVEs may be emboldened by the January 6, 2021 breach of the U.S. Capitol Building in Washington, D.C. to target elected officials and government facilities, “ it claims.

While the federal government regularly sends bulletins to state and local law enforcement agencies, Associated Press reports that this one is notable, “because it effectively places the Biden Administration into the politically charged debate over how to describe or characterize acts motivated by political ideology, and suggests it regards violence like the kind that overwhelmed the Capitol as akin to terrorism.” However, AP points out that the bulletin does not identify any particular threats.

Russian Officials Comment on Strategic Stability and Relations with the U.S.

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—The Russian response to the Biden Administration’s initial policy towards Russia has been one of cautious optimism, tempered by the poor state of U.S.-Russian relations. [Dmitry Polyanskiy](#), the Russian First Deputy Permanent Representative at the United Nations, responded to a question on what does Russia expect from the new administration, during an online press conference yesterday, “Now we have a little bit more reasons to be optimistic, because, as you know, yesterday our leaders, our Presidents spoke on the phone and there was an agreement to prolong for five years the START treaty. Actually, this has been the core of our position for many years.” But, he continued: “We also note the composition of the external policy team of the new administration. We see a lot of faces who are not at all unfamiliar to us. We know the position of these people vis-à-vis Russia. We understand that they will bring at least some ‘luggage’ with them to their new positions. That’s why we are a bit cautious. Of course, we will be judging the new administration and its attitude towards Russia by its actions. So far, the first action that we saw yesterday is very positive. I would also like to inform you that today the Russian Parliament already ratified this prolongation. The ball is on the U.S. side, and we hope that it will be done very quickly.”

“If the attitude towards Russia is about containment, picturing Russia as a kind of a rogue state, a country that deserves isolation and sanctions without a dialogue, without an understanding what is behind the situation in the world politics that we see right now, I do not think there will be much of a breakthrough. We are not too pessimistic, we are realists,” Polyanskiy went on.

Responding to a follow-up question specifically about the New START Treaty, Polyanskiy said that, “It does not deprive us of the possibility of a more all-embracing dialogue on strategic issues that we are ready to wage; we are ready to engage in any conversation on strategic issues on arms race.”

In Moscow, Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov said during his press conference yesterday that Moscow will resume its proposals for establishing a moratorium on the deployment of intermediate- and shorter-range missiles. “When Washington is finished with the process of forming its new team in charge of national security issues, including arms control, we will resume our proposals, of course, bring them to the fore again, and call for a meaningful dialogue. Not through microphones, not by means of exchanging comments in public, but in a normal fashion at the negotiating table,” Ryabkov said in reply to a question from TASS.

At the Kremlin, Russian presidential spokesman Dmitry Peskov opened the door to the possible restoration of the Open Skies Treaty, should the U.S. show interest in that. “President Putin underscored that, after the U.S. decided to withdraw from the Treaty on Open Skies, Russia was looking for ways, opportunities to remain in the treaty. However, these searches were fruitless, and negotiations with the Europeans brought nothing positive. In this regard, Russia has made its decision,” he said yesterday, reported TASS. “However, there is still a temporal lag, and if our American partners are ready to somehow continue the discussion, such opportunity still remains.”

Peskov reported that the two Presidents did not have time to discuss this issue in detail during the phone call. “But they did note that the discussion on the Open Skies Treaty can be continued,” the spokesman said.

More Declassified FBI Documents Exposing the Travesty of ‘Russiagate’

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—Supposedly, a special prosecutor had to be appointed in 2017 to investigate Donald Trump, because the President had fired FBI Director James Comey, and this meant that he was trying to obstruct justice. In the newly declassified documents from the FBI’s “Crossfire Hurricane” attempt at regime change, one learns that the Acting Director of the FBI in May 2017, Andrew McCabe, and his lieutenant, Lisa Page, knew that the Department of Justice plans were in the works since January 2017 to dump Comey—long before Trump got exasperated with him. They knew

there was no ‘obstruction of justice’ involved. Yet the Mueller travesty was initiated on that pretext. It’s almost as if an assault on the Capitol was planned beforehand and launched prior to Trump finishing his speech, but his speech allegedly launched the assault.

Investigative reporter [John Solomon](#) has been going through some of the documents which he covers in “Just the News” on Jan. 27. McCabe writes of a May 16, 2017, meeting in which he informed then-Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein of the obstruction probe: “I explained that the purpose of the investigation was to investigate allegations of possible collusion between the President and the Russian government, possible obstruction of justice related to the firing of FBI Director James Comey and possible conspiracy to obstruct justice.” Then, regarding Rosenstein’s supposed outrage over Comey’s firing, FBI attorney Lisa Page reports on the same meeting: “This was a strange comment, because it was my understanding that the DAG [Rosenstein] had previously indicated that he and AG [Attorney General Jeff] Sessions had been discussing firing Director Comey since January....” Finally, McCabe states of a second meeting on May 21: “We returned to our discussion from the morning meeting about the DAG’s [Rosenstein’s] memo on the firing of Director Comey. The DAG stated that based on conversations he had had with the AG [Sessions] as early as January 2017 he knew Director Comey was going to get fired.”

Otherwise, it turns out that President Trump actually asked Rosenstein to publicly state the circumstances of Comey’s firing—the Russia investigation—but, according to McCabe: “The DAG said to the president that he did not think this was a good idea and that his memo did not need to include Russia. The president replied that he understood but that he was asking the DAG to include Russia anyway.”

Separately, Solomon writes of the FBI transcript of Stefan Halper’s secret wire, attempting to entrap Carter Page, on October 17, 2016. Halper had been coached by the FBI to elicit information that would back up the Steele dossier allegations—in particular that Page had met with two

Russians, Igor Sechin and Igor Diveykin. Page was recorded saying that he knew that Sechin worked for Rosneft, but had never met him; and that he simply didn't recognize Diveykin's name: "There's another guy I had never even heard of.... The core lie is that I met with these sanctioned Russian officials, several of which I never even met in my entire life...." Despite this, four days later, the FBI surveillance warrant application was made to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court, asserting that Page had met with them and omitting the fact that Page had passed their test. Solomon quotes ex-FBI officials as to how flagrantly illegal it was to keep the exculpatory material from Page out of the FISA Court warrant applications. Evidently, this was a railroad that had to run on time—at least, before it ran off the tracks.

STRATEGIC WAR DANGER

Chinese Military Maneuvers Send Warning Signal to Taiwan

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—China has been increasing its activities in the vicinity of Taiwan in the last few days, with military training coming from Chinese ships close to Taiwan waters and overflights over a region bordering Taiwanese air space but within their air defense identification zone, to which Taiwan sent up fighters in response. PLA spokesman Wu Qian said today that these operations were “a stern response to the interference by external forces and the provocations of the Taiwan independence forces.... We are seriously telling those Taiwan independence forces: those who play with fire will burn themselves, and Taiwan independence means war. The Chinese People's Liberation Army will take all necessary measures to resolutely thwart any form of Taiwan independence separatist attempts and firmly defend national sovereignty and territorial integrity.”

Israeli Military Chief's Speech Criticizing Biden and Threatening Iran Sets Off Uproar in Israel

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—The Jan. 26 speech of Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Aviv Kohavi in which he harshly criticized the Biden Administration's assertions that it is considering bringing the U.S.

back into the 2015 Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) nuclear deal with Iran, and announced that he had ordered the development of new war plans for striking Iran's nuclear program, has caused an uproar in Israel. While there are variations among the criticisms, there seems to be a consensus that his remarks shows that there's no daylight between Kohavi and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Iran, including, if deemed necessary, on taking military action against Iran's nuclear program. This is reported, in several locations, to be a contrast to earlier periods, including in 2015, when the JCPOA was completed. IDF assessments at the time were that the JCPOA was better than no agreement at all.

Not everybody in Israel thinks that Kohavi should have gone public with such criticism of the U.S. and with the IDF's own intentions, though. "A nuclear Iran is a danger to the world, to the region and is a challenge to the security of Israel. Of course Israel must be prepared to defend itself in any way, but red lines are drawn in closed rooms," Defense Minister Benny Gantz said yesterday, reports the *Times of Israel*. The daily writes that it's unlikely that Kohavi would make such remarks without receiving approval from the Prime Minister's Office, implying a further widening of the divide on Iran policy between Gantz and Netanyahu.

But other criticism of his online speech to the Institute for National Security Studies conference targets Kohavi, not Netanyahu. Amos Gilad, a former head of Military Intelligence and former top Defense Ministry official, who criticized the Iran nuclear deal as "terrible," said that Israel should nevertheless refrain from publicly criticizing the Biden Administration, in order to ensure that it can make the deal as good as possible and get commitments from the U.S. to offset the potential damage to Israel's national security. "If you want to have a negotiation, with all due respect, the prime minister can have a quiet negotiation with the President of the United States. Why insult and excoriate? That's not how you lead policy," he said.

The *Jerusalem Post* reported that Kohavi apparently wanted to make clear "for all to see—the new administration, the Europeans, the Iranians—

that this time there is no daylight at all between the security establishment and Netanyahu on Iran.” And then there’s the timing. Biden had been in office six days when Kohavi made those remarks, and there’s an election coming up in Israel on March 23—the fourth one in two years.

On top of all that, Gen. Kenneth McKenzie, the commander of U.S. Central Command, is expected in Israel this week. This will be McKenzie’s first visit to Israel since responsibility for Israel was moved from European Command to Central Command. “There’s never been anything like this,” an unnamed security official who was taking part in closed security discussions on Iran, told *Ha’aretz*. “The timing of the statements is not clear. A new President, a general arriving, we’re in an election and suddenly the chief of staff presents a position that so far has not been presented to the cabinet or set at any point as Israel’s policy.”

In Tehran, the Iranians are dismissing it all as psywar. “Our people and people of the region are familiar with the language that the Zionist regime’s officials have used so far,” said Mahmoud Vaezi, President Hassan Rouhani’s chief of staff, going on to say that “the Zionists have neither a plan nor the capability to take action against Iran.” Maj. Gen. Abu Fadl Shikaraji, a spokesman for the Iranian military, threatened to “destroy Tel Aviv” if Israel “makes any mistake” against Iran. “Israel’s threats are part of psychological warfare, and if they are realistic, then they are illusions,” Shikaraji said, hyperbolically also stating that the Iranian army “will destroy Tel Aviv and erase it if Israel commits any stupidity against our nuclear facilities.”

COVID-19

New York State Attorney General Exposes Governor Cuomo’s Cover-Up of Nursing Home Deaths

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—New York State Attorney General Letitia James issued a report today saying that the death toll in the state’s nursing homes from COVID-19 was far worse than officials had disclosed—by as much as 50%. Gov. Andrew Cuomo is infamous for sending COVID-19 patients

back into nursing homes from the overcrowded hospitals. The figure for nursing home deaths used by the Cuomo Administration has been about 8,700. But investigators surveyed more than 60 nursing homes and found large discrepancies between the number of deaths recorded and numbers previously reported by state officials. The James's office says it is still "investigating those circumstances where the discrepancies cannot reasonably be accounted for," according to a statement in the report. "A larger number of nursing home residents died from COVID-19 than data reflected" from the New York Department of Health, the preliminary report concluded.

Attorney General James said that "it is imperative that we understand why the residents of nursing homes in New York unnecessarily suffered at such an alarming rate." She also said the investigation showed that many nursing homes in New York failed to comply with infection-control protocols and lacked sufficient personal protective equipment needed to keep residents safe.

COLLAPSING WESTERN FINANCIAL SYSTEM

EU Emissions Policy Giving Electric Carmakers 'the Hook'

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—*Forbes* reports in an article looking at Europe's e-car perspectives that the auto-making industry will not benefit from it, because "Fiat 500, Toyota Aygo, VW Up!, and Citroen C1 will soon get the hook, because profits are very hard to find, not least because the European Union, in its bid to slash carbon dioxide levels to zero by 2050, is making it increasingly expensive for car-makers to produce affordable, legal, internal combustion engine-powered vehicles. The EU is offering colossal subsidies to its citizens to buy electric cars at the same time," writes Neil Winton, in "Coronavirus Boosts Cheap Cars, but European Manufacturers Will Lose Out To Chinese; Report," on Jan. 25.

Winton goes on: "Sorry, but even with massive subsidies, Europeans on average wages still can't afford electric cars. But never fear, Chinese manufacturers are about to launch a raft of affordable, cute and affordable

practical little electric city cars priced at around \$6,000 after tax. Europe's car makers are nowhere to be seen in this market, where the cheapest electric cars cost more like \$25,000," he says, writing on a report by Capgemini consultancy.

An aspect strangely enough not mentioned in the *Forbes* article is that several leading European carmakers, such as Daimler and Volkswagen, are considering producing not just engines but also entire e-cars in China, with or without Chinese partner firms.

Nigel Farage, Like Antony Blinken, Denounces China for Providing Energy to Poor Nations

Jan. 28 (EIRNS)—Nigel Farage, who made his name as U.K. fighter for Brexit, has recently declared that he will now dedicate his life to mobilizing against China. In a *Newsweek* article today, Farage denounced Xi Jinping for his speech to the World Economic Forum on Jan. 25 calling for international cooperation to bring development to the entire world. Farage says he would like to ask Xi, that if he means it, "can I assume that you will personally undertake to stop building scores of new coal-fired power stations every year?"

This is the same complaint heard from Biden's new Secretary of State Antony Blinken, in his confirmation hearing this week, who said the Biden Administration will do everything it can to stop "dirty technology" from being developed in the poor nations, but complained that China's Belt and Road Initiative is building many coal plants around the world, and that they are financed by Chinese banks, so that any measures taken to restrict funding from "international institutions" would be little affected by such action.
