**LaRouche's Ideas Will Long Outlast Wall Street**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—The oh-so-clever strategy to force Russia into a corner is in for a bruising—and the geopoliticians willing to starve populations and deploy neo-Nazi killers may want to wish they didn't get out of bed on September 7. First, in Vladivostok, Russia, President Vladimir Putin will address the Seventh Eastern Economic Forum (EEF), with 60 nations deliberating the subject, “On the Path to a Multipolar World.” Putin's spokesperson, Dmitry Peskov, announced that his speech will address the “huge global storm” that has started, and will cover the “very intense, thoughtful and consistent work” going on in Moscow to create the “macroeconomic stability” to survive the “huge global storm.” Russia's “pivot to the East” is never more timely, and is dependent upon the marriage of the economies of Russia and Asia.

Then *Executive Intelligence Review* hosts a unique press conference on “Kiev's ‘Info Terrorist’ List: ‘Global NATO’ Issues Hit on Advocates of Peace,” in which Kiev's terror campaign of blacklists and hitlists will be confronted by the individuals they thought they could terrorize into silence. Some of the scheduled speakers are Scott Ritter, Ray McGovern, Col. Richard Black (ret.), and Diane Sare, candidate for U.S. Senate.

Otherwise, a few public officials stared into the face of reality—of deadly shortages of energy and water—and actually decided to think. A German economic official said it publicly: energy is vital, and keeping Germany's nuclear plants is key; the head of the EPA announced that nuclear power is “critical”; and California's governor said publicly that merely conserving water is a strategy of scarcity, and that it doesn't work—rather we need to “create water” by desalination. Just three examples, but the type of outbreak of sanity that could catch on.

Certainly, the “Global NATO” gang picked on the wrong people in going after the Schiller Institute; and Russia has been forced into breaking

with the speculative dollar and figuring out something more solid. Whether the terror campaign is broken, and whether the full Lyndon LaRouche science-driver (e.g., fusion and plasma physics) technologies drive the reorganized economy and guide national banking decisions, still hang in the balance. But the example of Lyndon LaRouche, of his unremitting courage and his brilliant combination of morality and genius, addresses both.

September 7 has all the potential to make LaRouche's 100th birthday on September 8 something really special. As one American patriot described their banners for public demonstrations on September 8, "LaRouche's ideas will long outlast Wall Street."

## NEW ECONOMIC SYSTEM

### **Vladivostok Economic Meeting Opens, with Russia's Plan To Avoid the West's 'Huge Global Storm' Hinging on Asia**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—The Seventh Eastern Economic Forum (EEF) opened Sept. 5 in Vladivostok, Russia, and will continue until Sept. 8. The theme is "On the Path to a Multipolar World." Russian President Vladimir Putin met with the moderators of the key sessions today and reflected upon the surprising importance that the EEF has taken on, "because, indeed, it turned out to be in great demand, especially in modern conditions, as we all understand now." Putin will address the [plenary session](#) tomorrow.

The Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov, in a TASS interview, provided an appetizer: "Most likely, a huge global storm is starting. In many ways, there are objective reasons for that, but there are also subjective reasons for this beginning storm, which are linked to absolutely illogical and often absurd decisions and actions of the authorities in the U.S., Europe, the EU

and individual European countries.” He maintained that the sanctions imposed upon Russia by the U.S., the EU and some other nations have backfired, causing a spike in energy prices and record inflation across the West. Then the key: In this situation, Russia “still manages to maintain macroeconomic stability. Very intense, thoughtful and consistent work is being carried out in order to achieve that. I am sure it will also be among the topics” of Putin’s address. He pointed in the obvious direction: “As restrictions are being artificially introduced in the West, [Russia’s] trade and economic relations are understandably starting to focus more on the East.”

There have been serious, sustained discussions amongst Moscow’s political, economic and financial circles regarding production-oriented, non-dollar economic arrangements. It is very likely that Peskov is referring to this, in his description of “very intense, thoughtful and consistent work” to achieve “macroeconomic stability.” Russia’s “pivot to the East” has taken on no insignificant strategic importance.

### **China Urges G7 Not To Play Games with Energy Supply, Regarding Effort To Cap Russian Oil Price**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—The Chinese Foreign Ministry’s new Deputy Director-General of the Information Department and spokeswoman Mao Ning, who gave the daily press conference today. RIA Novosti asked her about the Group of 7’s Sept. 2 effort to organize a bloc of oil purchasers that would dictate to Russia at what price they will be allowed to sell their oil, and wanted to know if “China is considering joining this move?”. She replied: “Oil is a global commodity. Ensuring global energy supply security is vitally important. We hope relevant countries will make constructive efforts to help ease the situation through dialogue and consultation, instead of doing the opposite.”

It is hard to imagine the G7 countries putting much of a hold on Russia’s oil trade if China refuses to cooperate.

## India Sees No 'Moral Conflict' in Buying Oil from Russia

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—In the wake of last week's G7 finance ministers' announcement of an attempted price cap on Russian oil sales, it is widely being acknowledged that the move will be useless unless nations such as China and India, neither members of the Group of 7, agree to the coalition. [Indian Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri](#) was interviewed on Sept. 5 by CNBC at the Gastech 2022 conference in Milan, and provided an instructional course in a real defense of peoples and values, against the ideological fantasies of hypocrites.

When Hadley Gamble asked about the price cap, he replied that there are many factors involved, such as the supply shortages, COVID disruptions, food and fertilizer shortages, all of which are complicating a response to such an initiative. "Now what will the proposal mean? We will look at it very carefully. Who will be the participants? What will be the implications, etc." When she then asked if he had a moral conflict by buying oil from Russia, Puri made his priorities clear: "No there's no conflict. I have a moral duty to my consumer. Do I as a democratically elected government want a situation where the petrol pump runs dry?" Gamble tried to trap him saying, that Russia "did invade a democratically elected country," he interrupted, "No I'm not getting into that debate. It's a question of energy.... And by the way, those that wanted to do that ideological punitive action—they're still buying [from Russia] and they're going to be buying for a while. So that moral conflict question should be asked to those who have addressed it."

Gamble was getting upset, so she goaded him further: "So who is responsible for the energy crisis? Russia or the West?" Puri replied by describing his 39 years as a diplomat, and that he was presiding on the UN Security Council and warned against use of force in Libya. "See what's happened to Libya today!" And in Syria, "see what's happening," he witnessed the resolutions calling for military intervention into Libya and then Syria. He warned: "Please be very careful about what you are

unleashing. Countries can get unraveled, and those consequences are still being felt.”

He discussed how 25% of the world increase in oil consumption will come from India, which with population of 1.4 billion, currently consumes 5 million barrels/day of oil, a number which will continue to go up to 6, 7, even 9 and beyond, and if India cannot navigate this current economic and energy crisis, and isolate its citizens from that, the consequences will be terrible. “Energy is the lifeline of economies,” he insisted. But the hypocrisy is astounding: Whereas India buys 0.2% of its oil from Russia, “the Europeans buy more [oil from Russia] in one afternoon than I do in a quarter,” the Minister charged. (Of course, the Minister could also have noted that India is being attacked by the West for not stopping its purchases from Russia, while at the same time Europeans are attacking Russia for not allowing purchases by Europe!)

To make matters even worse for Western ideologues, Puri did not spare those talking about going “green” in an energy crisis such as exists today. “Again you have to be realistic about that. If you don’t survive at the point at which you are now, the chances of being able to make the [green] transition are going to be just that much more difficult,” he added, chuckling.

### **Senior German Economist Argues for Berlin To Keep Nuclear Plants Open**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—It sounds like a “man bites dog” story, but it is refreshing for a Western government official to look at reality and then state the obvious. As reported by Funke Media group newspapers, Veronika Grimm, a member of the German government’s chief economic advisory council, stated: “In view of the price development on the electricity market, everything must be done to mobilize generation capacities that can be made available at short notice.”

The price of electricity increased above €1,000/MWh at the end of August at the speculative power exchange EEX in Leipzig.

Grimm continued that Germany's nuclear power plants should continue to run beyond the planned shutdown date at year end, and not put on standby. Only then would there be a lowering effect on the price of electricity. "For the three nuclear power plants that are still running, we should think about extending their operating lives by five years," she said. Furthermore, it should be examined whether the three nuclear power plants that were shut down at the end of 2021 could be reactivated.

### **EPA Head Embraces Nuclear Energy**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—Michael Regan, head of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, said at a joint press conference with Japanese Environment Minister Akihiro Nishimura on Sept. 2, that "the opportunities for advanced nuclear technology will be critical if we're going to meet our climate goals.... I think the science tells us that we have to respond to the climate crisis with a sense of urgency, and nuclear energy and nuclear technology has, and can have a role in continuing with a zero-emissions contribution to the climate."

Japan's new Prime Minister Fumio Kishida on Aug. 24 made the decision to return the country to nuclear power production, with plan to operate up to 17 nuclear power plants beginning in the summer of 2023. On Aug. 24, Japan signed the statement on the "FIRST Program" whose partners "work collaboratively to facilitate the safe and secure utilization of civilian nuclear reactors, especially SMRs," referring to the small modular nuclear reactors. The FIRST program takes advantage "of advanced nuclear technologies and upcoming innovations in reactor design to meet their energy security and climate goals...."

## **WHEN NAZIS ACT LIKE NAZIS**

### **Did the U.S. State Department Have Anything To Do with the Attempted Assassination of Argentine Vice-President Cristina Fernández De Kirchner?**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—This is a question that is being asked with growing urgency in significant circles in Argentina, Mexico, and other Ibero-

American nations, who are outraged by the brazen attempted assassination of Argentine Vice-President Cristina Fernández de Kirchner on Sept. 1, and its implications for the region and the world.

For example, on the Sept. 5 edition of the Mexican radio program “Journalists’ Voices,” host Celeste Sáenz—who is also the Secretary General of the Journalists’ Club of Mexico—opened the show by stating that “it is scandalous that the Center for Countering Disinformation in Ukraine is being financed by the U.S., and that journalists are being fingered as ‘information terrorists.’ Just how far does the U.S. want to go? Just look at the way they’ve treated Julian Assange.” Sáenz then drew the connection to the Cristina Fernández de Kirchner case, and turned the floor over to *EIR*’s Mexican representative, Gerardo Castilleja, to both elaborate on that connection and invite journalists to attend the Sept. 7 international press conference on this matter.

As Castilleja and *EIR* have made clear, there are three interrelated sets of facts that are cause for alarm:

1) Fernando Sabag Montiel, the would-be assassin of the Argentine Vice President, had prominent tattoos on his body of the symbols of the Ukrainian Azov Battalion, including the “Black Sun” and the Azov swastika, while his Facebook page showed his great admiration for various neo-Nazi groups.

2) This Nazi Azov pattern was also prominent with the perpetrators of the bloody massacre in Buffalo, New York, in May of this year, and the carnage at two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand, in March of 2019.

3) The U.S. State Department is financing, sponsoring, and promoting the Ukrainian government agency, the Center for Countering Disinformation (CCD), which answers to that country’s Presidency, and which is publishing hit lists of national and international enemies whose so-called “disinformation” (that is, their promotion of a negotiated solution to the war) must be silenced. Many of those featured on the CCD hit list are then included in the list of “criminals to be eliminated” published by the avowedly fascist “Myrotvorets” website/hit squad in Ukraine. The Russian

journalist Darya Dugina, assassinated on August 20, was on the Myrotvorets list before she was killed, and the next day they published her photo with a red line across it, along with the word “liquidated.” Myrotvorets features the same Nazi symbols used by the Azov Battalion in Ukraine, including the “Black Sun” and the Azov swastika.

## UNITED STATES

### **Zelensky Renews Call for Making Russia a ‘Terrorist State,’ but Biden Says ‘No’**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—Last night’s installment of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky’s long-running television series—that is, his nightly message to the nation—featured a paean to Boris Johnson and to Ukraine’s love affair with Great Britain: “And I want to emphasize: even before February 24, we always felt that Britain stood with Ukraine. In a few years, we really managed to bring Ukrainian-British relations to the highest level throughout the entire time of our independence.”

Then, he renewed his completely evidence-free assertion that Russia had destroyed the power line to the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant (ZNPP). Actually, it is not so much that it is evidence free, as Zelensky disdains the idea of offering any evidence.

Zelensky continued: “Shelling the territory of the ZNPP means that the terrorist state does not care what the IAEA says, it does not care what the international community decides. Russia is interested only in keeping the situation the worst for the longest time possible. This can be corrected only by strengthening sanctions, only by officially recognizing Russia as a terrorist state—at all levels.” One can only wonder, if he would take a breath and explain why the Russians are firing upon themselves, or if the remnants of the American shells at the ZNPP were shown to him, would he call for declaring Ukraine a terrorist state? Regardless, his previous television series was more entertaining.

Shortly afterwards, President Joe Biden, returning to the White House last night from his campaigning, was asked by Reuters reporter Jeff Mason, “if Russia should be designated a state sponsor of terrorism.” Biden provided one of his most cogent lines of his Presidency: “No.”

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov, when asked on RBC-TV today, responded positively to Biden’s answer. “The very formulation of the issue is monstrous. And, of course, it is good that the U.S. President responded in

this way.” He offered his opinion that “even asking such a question is something that is very difficult to understand.”

Prior to these developments, Russia’s ambassador in Washington, Anatoly Antonov, as reported by TASS, warned in an interview with the government newspaper *Rossiyskaya Gazeta* published Sept. 5, that Russia will make a very harsh response, should the U.S. declare Russia a state sponsor of terrorism. “I would like to note that declaring us a ‘terrorism sponsor state’ would become an unprecedentedly cynical decision, which will lead to the harshest reciprocal action from our side.” The complete interview is available in English on the [Embassy’s Telegram](#) channel.

### **Judge Rules in Favor of Trump’s Seeking a Special Master To Review Documents Seized by the FBI**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—U.S. District Judge Aileen Cannon ruled in favor of former President Donald Trump’s request for a special master to review the documents seized by the FBI, despite the Department of Justice (DOJ) avowal that they had already reviewed the documents themselves. The special master is to make judgments on documents that are personal, those protected by attorney-client privilege, or by executive privilege.

The Justice Department’s Aug. 30 filing had simply disregarded Trump’s filing, which said the DOJ’s bias and animus against him, as displayed in their “Russiagate” operation (or “Crossfire Hurricane” operation), was obvious and had never been cured. Further, the Justice Department had maintained that Trump was not entitled to the return of any of the Presidential records that were taken, since he is no longer President and the documents, therefore, do not belong to him. And what of the personal items seized? No problem—the personal items that were seized, being commingled with classified information, therefore had potential value as evidence. The judge was not impressed by the Justice argument.

Finally, the DOJ had argued that Trump lacked standing to request a special master, because his Presidential records were owned by the government, not Trump himself. The judge dismissed the objection, countering that although Trump may not have ownership of many of the

materials, “genuine disputes” exist as to whether other items constituted personal records. The judge also stated that the DOJ “arguably overstates the law” when they contend that the current President’s executive privilege cancels out a former President’s executive privilege. The DOJ attempt to create a new precedent, as if it were a decided issue, did not slip past the Judge Cannon.

Both sides get to submit candidates for the special master. Meanwhile, the DOJ is supposed to temporarily halt their use of the documents that they seized.

### **Liz Cheney Believes Her Mass Electoral Defeat Means Many Republicans Are ‘Very Sick’**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—The day after losing her Aug. 16 primary race for re-election to the U.S. House of Representatives from Wyoming, Liz Cheney formed her new political action committee, entitled “The Great Task.” It is to cleanse the Republican Party of “election deniers.” Curiously, Cheney displayed a bit of election denial herself, explaining that her defeat actually reflects the “very dangerous” reality that voters believe the 2020 presidential election was riddled with fraud. “I think it also tells you that large portions of our party, including the leadership of our party, both at a state level in Wyoming as well as on a national level with the RNC [Republican National Committee], is very sick.”

## **EUROPE**

### **Dutch Agriculture Minister Resigns**

Sept. 6 (EIRNS)—Dutch Agriculture Minister Henk Staghouwer announced his resignation on Twitter on Monday, Sept. 5 after nine months in office. “When I began the job, I knew it was an enormous challenge. I asked myself if I were the right person for the job, and over this past weekend came to the conclusion that I am not.” Staghouwer’s face was featured on farmer’s placards, in their demonstrations, captioned “Stop the Madness, Stop the WEF Cabinet,” referring to the Malthusian billionaires club, the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland.
