**Afghanistan, Seen from the Complex Domain**

July 20 (EIRNS)—Something may be developing in Afghanistan, involving forces from the United States, Russia, China, Pakistan, and several nations of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization. You can tell, because everything in the power of British “intelligence” is being done to force Biden to denounce China and Xi Jinping, now through re-running “Russiagate” as “the Chinese hacked Microsoft.” The United States, the British declare, must not be allowed to do with China what it has just done with Russia through person-to-person talks between the heads of state. American representatives, however, have been involved in high-level discussions whose prospects for changing disastrous, decades-long failed policy are as promising as our efforts, and those of our allies, will make them. All concentration must be forced in the direction of undermining the axioms of Anglo-American failure that have characterized the past 20 years, since the still-unexplained events of 9/11, and the derived “Responsibility To Protect” preventive war policies—practices declared as “crimes against humanity” at Nuremberg in 1949, policies that were also instigated, as in 2002-2003 through British intelligence’s “dodgy dossier.”

The international strategic deployment which is the subject of the three-movement organizing process of the next month, indicated by the “date-markers” July 24, July 31, and August 14, requires what Lyndon LaRouche referred to as “visualizing the complex domain.”

In the spirit of “listening to the wise words of Lyndon LaRouche,” it were advisable to consult his conception of creativity in music in order to understand how to better inform what we are actually trying to do in these next 30 days. The following is from a September 14, 1995, memo, “Comment on Renée Sigerson’s Memo on Opus 131.”

**“How Musical Ideas Become**

“The relevant special significance of the Op. 131, is that its organization, as a whole, around transitions, forces the musician to attend to the reality, that the idea of the composition as a whole, is nothing other than a platonic ‘One,’ for which the ordering of the ‘Many’ according to nothing but a constant notion of change is the crucial feature of the development. Compare this with the case of our now-much-cited case of the Eratosthenes’ estimate of the curvature of the Earth. It is the manifest inconsistency among a series of astronomical observations, which is the experiential referent for Eratosthenes’ idea of the curvature of the Earth. It is the process of reducing that series of errors to a notion of ordered change, which leads to the idea of curvature. So in a musical developmental process, it is the adducing of the existence of an ordering principle which subsumes a series of developmentally ordered changes, which implies the idea of the composition as a whole.

“Thus, if one states the formal expression of the developmental ordering of the entirety of the Opus 131, the idea of the composition as a whole is implicitly stated as the platonic idea of a unified process of Becoming. This implies the corresponding attempt to generate the notion of a Good.”

Leibniz’s idea of the Good in politics, an idea which was the bedrock of the American Revolution’s “the pursuit of Happiness,” is what the Schiller Institute, as another form of expression of the intent of the LaRouche Presidential campaigns, is daring to promulgate through proposals like the present Afghanistan initiative that we have suddenly, without preparation or warning, “so nobly advanced.” The Good always poses the greatest threat to the self-doomed imperialists of empires, most emphatically the British.

The “arc” of our intervention, including its July 24, July 31 and August 14 inflection points, is a single process of change, a “One,” intended to secure the establishment of an international agreement, among Russia, China, the United States, and India, to spearhead the successful and timely creation of a world health platform as the basis for the eradication of poverty and pandemic disease planet-wide. That proposal, not “zero carbon

emissions,” is a worthwhile goal for 2030-2040. It should be adopted by those nations, as China adopted the ending of poverty for itself, and accomplished it; but, now, given to the world as the mission for Earth’s next generation (next 25 years). Earth’s next 50 years as discussed in the eponymous work of Lyndon LaRouche, is the “envelope,” as well as the “pedal point” for the discussions of the next month, particularly that of August 14-15.

Given “the march of folly” we see displayed once again in the completely predictable “resurgence” of the coronavirus pandemic, as well as in the foolish “war maneuvers and war games” against Russia and China, that health platform may be the only available pathway to avoid the self-immolation of trans-Atlantic civilization, which the tragic, “Wagnerian” performance of many nations’ present leadership-circles foreshadows. Afghanistan has been proposed by Helga Zepp-LaRouche as the theater of battle upon which we must intervene for the adoption of that “reversal of fortune.” We can be the non-tragic exception to the rulers. We are capable of changing their axiomatic, compulsive doom of their nations. Afghanistan is only the graveyard for empires; for patriots and world citizens, it can be the land of a thousand cities, and the New Silk Road—just as it once was, but better. What we propose may be opposite to every instinct of the world’s ruling bodies of the past half-century, but it is natural for those who consider humanity’s General Welfare to be the first and only truly human unit of measurement of progress. The too-long-deferred dream of FDR, Sukarno, Nkrumah, Nehru, JFK, Pope Paul VI, Martin Luther King, and many others, the dream of Hamilton’s First, and Lincoln’s Second American Revolution, is achievable, if we choose to visualize it, as Beethoven and LaRouche do.

## UNITED STATES POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC

### **Stock Market Drop Jacked Up Trump to Demand Reparations from China for COVID-19**

July 20 (EIRNS)—Former President Donald Trump sent out a message on his Telegram account last night which first cited the headline: “DOW sinks over 900 points amid concerns over rising COVID cases, delta variant,” and then pushed the British line: “Why isn’t China being held responsible for this? The World was set ablaze with the horrible China Virus, and nothing happens. How long will this Virus be allowed to bring death and chaos to so many, with no repercussions or reparations?”

### **China Counters Anglo-American ‘Ganging Up’ against Beijing with Empty Hacking Allegations**

July 20 (EIRNS)—China has forcefully countered accusations that it is engaged in a global hacking campaign, in response to U.S. and U.K. government statements on July 19 alleging that hackers affiliated with China’s Ministry of State Security were involved in the cyberattacks on the Microsoft Exchange email software in March.

China’s Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian responded to a question from Reuters today: “The U.S. ganged up with its allies to make groundless accusations out of thin air against China on the cyber security issue. ... China firmly opposes and combats all forms of cyber attacks. It will never encourage, support or condone cyber attacks. This position has been consistent and clear. Given the virtual nature of cyberspace and the fact that there are all kinds of online actors who are difficult to trace, it’s important to have enough evidence when investigating and identifying cyber-related incidents. It requires extra prudence when linking cyber attacks with the government of any country. The so-called technical details released by the U.S. side do not constitute a complete chain of evidence.

“In fact, the U.S. is the world's largest source of cyber attacks. According to a report of 360, a Chinese cyber security firm ... showed that APT-C-39, a cyber attack organization of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency, has carried out cyber infiltration and attacks on China for 11 years

in key areas such as aerospace, science and research institutions, oil industry, large Internet companies and government agencies,” he said.

He went on to cite U.S. using Danish intelligence to spy on its NATO and other allies “while making a fuss about ‘China's cyber attacks’ based on hearsay evidence.

“The cyber attack is a common threat faced by all. We always hold that countries should safeguard cyber security through dialogue and cooperation on the basis of mutual respect, mutual trust and mutual benefit. ... China once again strongly demands that the U.S. and its allies stop cyber theft and attacks targeting China, stop slinging mud at China on this issue, and revoke the so-called indictment.”

## COVID AND FAMINE

### **Cuba Receiving Financial and Medical Aid Offers from 51 Countries, as Syringes Also Start To Flow In**

July 20 (EIRNS)—According to the daily *Granma*, the Cuban government has reported that it has received a total of 543 offers of financial, medical and other assistance from 51 countries to assist it in combatting the COVID pandemic. Offers have come from Russia, China, several African and Southwest Asia nations, Canada, the European Union, and Central and South America. Several UN agencies are also involved. The Biden administration announced today that it intends to send humanitarian aid, but no details as to what that will include. Meanwhile, the Cuban government is setting up special bank accounts and other vehicles through which donations can be sent.

Moreover the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC), of which Mexico is the President Pro Tempore, will be sending 100,000 syringes to Cuba, urgently needed, because the economic embargo and sanctions have made it impossible for Havana to obtain them, in order to vaccinate its population with the COVID vaccines it has developed. In addition, Cuban citizens resident in the Dominican Republic are also a fundraising campaign called “One Million Syringes for Cuba.” A couple of

months ago, Cuba had reported it needed 30 million syringes, to which charitable and Cuban support groups internationally responded, purchasing and sending syringes to the island. But recently, the government said it still needs 20 million, and international efforts are continuing to obtain them.

## NEW WORLD ECONOMIC ORDER

### U.S. Signs Declarations with Central Asian States on Connectivity and Afghanistan

July 20 (EIRNS)—To review what is publicly known about the participation of the U.S. delegation at the “International Conference on Central and South Asia Regional Connectivity, Challenges and Opportunities,” in Tashkent, Uzbekistan on July 15-16: The Biden team signed two declarations with the Central Asia republics in support of connectivity and integrating Afghanistan into Central Asian transportation networks. One communiqué was with the so-called “C5+1,” which includes the United States and the five Central Asian republics of Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Kyrgyzstan—all except Turkmenistan are members of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO). Another declaration was signed among the U.S., Pakistan, Uzbekistan, and Afghanistan.

According to White House briefing July 17, the U.S. delegation was led by the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and Counter-Terrorism Dr. Elizabeth Sherwood-Randall, and included other representatives from National Security Council, the Defense Department, and State Department and Special Representative for Afghanistan Reconciliation Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad, and the U.S. Ambassador to Uzbekistan Daniel Rosenblum.

In her address to the conference, Sherwood-Randall spoke of the “30 years of partnership between the United States and the countries of Central Asia, as well as the U.S. government’s commitment to realizing the region’s potential as a transit, trade, and energy hub.” She “emphasized the importance of infrastructure development that safeguards the environment

and meets the highest international standards, consistent with the aims of the new G7-led Build Back Better World initiative.”

On the sidelines of the conference she participated in a roundtable meeting of the C5+1 diplomatic platform for Central Asia, after they issued a declaration “seeking opportunities to strengthen connectivity between the Central and South Asian regions via trade, transport, and energy link” and that “terrorists and third-party forces must never be allowed to use Afghan territory to threaten or attack the C5+1 countries or any other country.”

At the SCO Contact Group on Afghanistan meeting held on July 13-14, which included the five Central Asian republics, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi pressed the group to “weigh in” on the United States joining the reconstruction of Afghanistan, and not shirking its responsibility for the current situation. He stressed that the U.S. should honor recent statements in which the readiness to help Afghanistan maintain stability and conduct a peaceful reconstruction was expressed. (Wang and Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov also attended the connectivity conference.)

The [second communiqué](#) was an agreement-in-principle that Pakistan, Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, and the U.S. form a new diplomatic platform “focused on enhancing regional connectivity,” in which “the parties intend to cooperate to expand trade, build transit links, and strengthen business-to-business ties.” The parties also “consider long-term peace and stability in Afghanistan critical to regional connectivity and agree that peace and regional connectivity are mutually reinforcing.” They agreed to meet in the coming months to determine the modalities of this cooperation with mutual consensus.

### **Lavrov: Developing Central Asia, Afghanistan Opens ‘New Vistas’ for Eurasian Continent, and U.S. Participation Needed**

July 20 (EIRNS)—Russian Foreign Minister [Sergey Lavrov](#) captured the potential world-transforming change which can be brought about if the nations of the world join in developing Afghanistan and the Central Asian nations, when he addressed the conference on “Central and South Asia:

Regional Connectivity, Challenges and Opportunities” in Tashkent, Uzbekistan on July 16.

“The representative nature of this event is vivid proof of the increasing demand for a unification agenda in Eurasia and the rest of the world,” he began, in thanking Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev for organizing the conference. He situated the building of connectivity between Central and South Asia within the greater project of developing the giant continent of Eurasia as one “seamless, united logistical” economic hub of transportation, trade, power, development.

“Russia has been consistently in favor of forming the Greater Eurasian Partnership, a congregative integration contour in the entire space from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific, one that is maximally free for the movement of goods, capital, the workforce and services, and open, without exception, to all the countries of our common continent, Eurasia, and the integration unions created there, including the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU), the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations,” all organizations which have displayed an interest in this initiative, Lavrov explained.

“Implementing this long-term project will make it possible not only to accelerate the economic development of all participants but also to create a reliable material foundation of common security, stability and prosperity.”

He cited, in particular, the efforts which seek to integrate the EAEU plans and the Belt and Road project and “the North-South International Transport Corridor linking Europe, and the South Caucasus and Central Asia with the Indian Ocean coast, as well as to the Europe-West China transcontinental transport route.”

“In this broad context, higher connectivity between Central and South Asia is opening new vistas for the development of trade, economic and investment processes on the Eurasian continent....”

This will not happen without a comprehensive settlement of the Afghanistan conflict, he argued; “only direct and inclusive intra-Afghan

talks with the support of international partners can lead to a lasting peace.” Lavrov named three “tried and tested mechanisms” as key to mobilizing that support: the Shanghai Cooperation Organization-Afghanistan Contact Group, and the two known as the “Moscow format” and the “extended Troika,” the latter formed by the U.S., Russia, China, and Pakistan working together.

When a reporter at Lavrov’s [discussion with the press](#) in Tashkent asked him if he thought the U.S. had deliberately carried out its withdrawal in such a way as to cause trouble in Russia’s “area of geopolitical interests,” Lavrov refused to take the bait. “I do not believe in conspiracy theories. I heard that perhaps this hasty withdrawal was in pursuit of some kind of geopolitical goals. We should not speculate about it.”

Russia is “not interested in chaos” in Afghanistan, and “we will continue working with the Americans in the extended Troika format, as well as with all other countries that can influence the situation in Afghanistan,” he answered.

## GREEN NEW DEAL

### **Green Cartels’ U.S. ‘Wind Corridor’ Is Also Top ‘Food Corridor’—They Plan for You To Starve in the Dark**

July 20 (EIRNS)—The “wind corridor” in the Central U.S.—Dakotas south through Texas—created by the green rip-off interruptibles cartel, is also the “food corridor” for the entire United States, as well as for a large part of the world. The two states in the center of the wind corridor, Iowa and Kansas, head the nation with the highest share of their electricity coming from wind and solar: Iowa, 49% and Kansas, 43%, in addition to which, there are still more “renewables” projects underway here, and more shutdowns of coal and nuclear.

## STRATEGIC WAR DANGER

### Russia To Hold Military Maneuvers with Tajikistan and Uzbekistan Near Afghan Border

July 20 (EIRNS)—Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan plan to hold major maneuvers at the beginning of August along the Afghan-Tajik border amid increasing concern over Taliban offensives against government troops in northern Afghanistan. The commander of Russia's Central Military District Col.-Gen. [Aleksandr Lapin](#), told reporters on July 19 that the drills will be held on Tajikistan's Harb-Maidon military field on Aug. 5-10. "During the exercises, we will polish joint military efforts against illegal armed formations that intervene into the territory of an ally country," Lapin said.

In recent weeks there has been a continual increase of refugees from Afghanistan into Tajikistan and Uzbekistan, including police and

government troops, amid a Taliban offensive in the region. The militants have captured around one-third of Afghanistan's 423 districts since the start of the international military withdrawal on May 1.

### **U.S. May Consider Sanctioning Iran Oil Imports to China To Pressure Iran on Vienna Nuclear Talks**

July 20 (EIRNS)—The Biden Administration is developing options for jacking up the pressure on Iran to resume the nuclear talks in Vienna. One plan being drafted would choke off Iran's swelling crude-oil sales to China, the country's main client, through fresh sanctions targeting the shipping networks that help export an estimated 1 million barrels a day and bring critical revenue to Iran, unnamed administration officials told the *Wall Street Journal* yesterday. "There is not much left to sanction in Iran's economy," said one of the U.S. officials. "Iran's oil sales to China is the prize." No decision has been made on proceeding, the officials said. There are risks that the effort could backfire, driving Iran to accelerate its nuclear program. Other options are also being considered, the officials said.

According to the *Journal*, Iran's oil exports, mostly to China, have risen to 1.5 million barrels per day since Biden's inauguration from a low during the Trump administration of about 500,000 barrels. That angers the Pompeo Republicans, who have said an apparent lack of enforcement and the prospect of repealing most sanctions are weakening Washington's diplomatic leverage and emboldening Tehran. Biden administration officials bristle at the notion that they're not enforcing the sanctions, citing recently announced prosecutions and black-listings of Iranians and their associates for alleged violations of oil-trade sanctions.

### **U.K. To Keep Two Ships in Western Pacific**

July 20 (EIRNS)—British Defense Secretary Ben Wallace, on a visit to Tokyo following stops at the Pentagon and Hawaii over the last few days, announced today that, following the visit to Japan of the *HMS Queen Elizabeth* aircraft carrier strike group (CSG-21) in September, the Royal Navy will permanently deploy two offshore patrol vessels and a special forces "Littoral Response Group" to the region, "thereby demonstrating the

U.K.’s commitment to collective defense and security in the region in the decades ahead.” After announcing the ports in Japan that the strike group will visit, Wallace said that “the upcoming visit of the U.K.-led Carrier Strike Group to five ports across the country is a clear demonstration of our commitment to maintaining regional security and upholding the rules-based international order with Japan.”

Prior to his arrival in Tokyo, Wallace met with U.S. Indo-Pacific Command commander Adm. John Aquilino at his headquarters in Pearl Harbor. According to a statement issued by the U.K. Ministry of Defense, they agreed that the *Queen Elizabeth* strike group will undertake a series of multinational exercises with global allies in the Philippine Sea this August. “Operating alongside Naval and Air Forces from the United States, Australia, France, Japan, New Zealand, and the Republic of Korea, the U.K. Carrier Strike Group will undertake a number of integration exercises designed to build interoperability between like-minded international partners in this globally significant region of the world,” the statement said. “The *HMS Queen Elizabeth*-led Strike Group will operate with a U.S. Carrier Strike Group, which combined, will be the largest concentration of F-35 jets anywhere in the world.”

CSG-21 “embodies the Prime Minister’s vision for the U.K. as an outward facing, modern and responsible international actor who also takes its global defense and security responsibilities seriously and invests in them accordingly,” said Wallace. “As we witness a tilt in power towards the Indo-Pacific region, we are committed to working with our partners here to defend democratic values, tackle shared threats and keep our nations safe.” Imperial “Global Britain” pretensions at their wordy best.

### **British GCHQ Takes Credit for Instigating Fraud That ‘Chinese Government Hacked Microsoft’**

July 20 (EIRNS)—“The U.K. has revealed that Chinese state-backed actors were responsible for gaining access to computer networks around the world via Microsoft Exchange Servers,” the U.K. [National Cyber Security Center](#) (NCSC) announced in a press statement yesterday. The aim of this alleged

“most significant and widespread cyber intrusion against the U.K. and allies uncovered to date,” the NCSC asserted, was “to enable large-scale espionage” by the Chinese state.

The hacking of Microsoft’s business servers was detected last March. Then, yesterday, the great outcry became that China has been “proven” to have been behind the hacking. How timely. President Biden has been seeking a meeting with President Xi Jinping, and last week, a State Department spokesman named Afghanistan as one of the few areas where the U.S. and China can cooperate.

U.K. Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab and U.S. Secretary of State Tony Blinken issued parallel statements, Blinken’s pontificating that China’s “pattern of irresponsible, disruptive, and destabilizing behavior in cyberspace ... poses a major threat to our economic and national security,” Raab’s promising the “Chinese government must end this systematic cyber sabotage and can expect to be held account if it does not.”

And what is the NCSC? An agency of Great Britain’s Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ) intelligence and cyber agency, notorious for, amongst other things, its leading role in the “Russiagate” operation against U.S. President Donald Trump which sank his efforts to establish a working relationship with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

NCSC has now announced that it has “assessed that it was highly likely that a group known as HAFNIUM, which is associated with the Chinese state, was responsible for the activity” of “gaining access to computer networks around the world via Microsoft Exchange servers.” Furthermore, that “the U.K. is also attributing the Chinese Ministry of State Security as being behind activity known in open source as ‘APT40’ and ‘APT31.’ Activity relating to APT40 included the targeting maritime industries and naval defense contractors in the U.S. and Europe, and for APT31 the targeting of government entities, including the Finnish parliament in 2020.”

The small print of a chart accompanying the NCSC statement admits that it has no proof for any of its three key points:

The NCSC is only “*almost certain*” that the Microsoft Exchange hack was carried out by the HAFNIUM; it is only “*highly likely*” that HAFNIUM is associated with the Chinese state; and likewise only “*highly likely*” that the attack “enabled large-scale espionage” [emphasis added]. (As for the APT31 group charged with targeting Finland, the NCSC is also “almost certain” that those hackers are affiliated to the Chinese state, and it isn’t even “highly likely,” only “likely,” that it works for China’s Ministry of State Security.)

A hue and cry has arisen as to why the U.S. did not impose sanctions on China for its “almost certain” hacking. Yesterday, Biden defended that decision on the grounds that “it is my understanding that the Chinese government, not unlike the Russian government, is not doing this themselves, but are protecting those who are doing it and maybe even accommodating them being able to do it.”

## COLLAPSING WESTERN FINANCIAL SYSTEM

### Flash Floods in Germany Caused Billions of Euros in Damage as Alarm System Failed

July 20 (EIRNS)—The mid-July flash flood that swept parts of Germany, which caused the deaths of at least 160 Germans, and caused billions of euros in damage, as well as in Belgium and Holland which also suffered some flooding. The *Süddeutsche Zeitung* reports that the German Federal government expects that the damage to the German railway system and roads will top €2 billion, €1.3 billion of that for the railways alone.

The task force of the Federal Ministry of Transport, the Federal highway company, met on July 19 to determine the extent of the damage and begin the reconstruction of destroyed bridges, tracks, roads, and cell phone towers. Bavarian Minister-President Markus Söder announced that his state will make €50 million available for flash flood victims in addition to the Federal government’s €300 million. Even more massive damage occurred in the states of North Rhine-Westphalia and the Rhineland-Palatinate, but the amount of emergency aid has not been reported.

The flash flood exposed that the digitized flood warning system, which only announces an impending potential threat through a cell phone app, was an abject failure. There are now demands for a return to the very effective analogue system of “good old sirens.” The German Fire Brigade Association President Karl-Heinz Banse told the Bayerischer Rundfunk radio network that it makes more sense “if the siren systems are rebuilt across the board” and people are properly trained in their meaning.

“The digital alarm does not work if there is no sound,” remarked the Executive Director of the Rhineland-Palatinate County Council Burkhard Müller. “We have to establish new siren signals.” The established signals, for example for air raid alarms or an ABC weapons attacks are no longer up to date. He pointed out that the breakdowns on September 10, 2020, when Germany authorities had arranged a nationwide “Warning Day” to test the civil alarm systems had shown that the Federal government had to provide more financing for siren systems. “We absolutely have to accelerate this now and bring it up to a high technical standard,” he argued.

Another fear raised is that rescue efforts could spark a rise in of COVID-19 cases in the area. “Many people are coming together in a tight space to deal with this crisis. We must be careful that managing this disaster does not become a super-spreader event,” said David Freichel of the Rhineland-Palatinate state’s coronavirus communications staff told media. The State Health Ministry is preparing a special vaccination campaign in the disaster areas in consultation with local authorities.
