Will You Qualify Yourself?

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—The discussion in Plato's drama known as *The Republic* is of the creation of an ideal society. We are far from such an ideal society today, but one issue that is raised by Socrates in that dialogue is of tremendous relevance. Even if the members of the dialogue worked out an ideal way of directing society, *what would the next generation do?* Lyndon LaRouche addresses something similar in his book, *France After de Gaulle*, when he points to the impossibility of relying on a benign

tyranny as a structure of government: “The ... more profound objection to the choice of oligarchical government is that the associated estrangement of the overwhelming majority from responsibility for the shaping of policy causes and perpetuates a corresponding tendency for moral degradation among the subjects of a nation.”

He asks: “How do we impart the powers—the qualifications—of citizenship to the adult members of society generally?”

Attempt to answer that question after a review of the crises confronting the world, the existing solutions already beckoning, and the greater potentials still to be created.

The strategy employed by the financial-military empire centered in London, Wall Street, and Washington to maintain its power and its system is mass-murderous in its intention. The confrontation between oligarchical financial rule and the breakdown of the physical economy on which it feeds will be resolved. But how?

Will it be through a Glass-Steagall bankruptcy reorganization guided by a recommitment to the economic principles of the American System, as developed upon by Lyndon LaRouche, for science and technology-driven growth in productivity?

Or will it be through geopolitical warfare to prevent the rise and sovereignty of China and Russia, accompanied with a new supranational power structure of supremacy through financial “regime change” and physical economic collapse enforced through the false crisis of “climate change”? AFGHANISTAN

Dire Humanitarian Crisis Looming for Afghanistan

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—The Asia Pacific Director of the [International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies](#) (IFCR) Alexander Matheou has joined his voice to the growing warnings that Afghanistan is ill-equipped to deal with the pending dire humanitarian crisis unless it receives the funds and aid so desperately needed to prevent the collapse of the healthcare system and starvation of the population. “We are deeply concerned that Afghanistan faces imminent collapse of health services and worsening hunger if aid and money do not flow into the country within weeks. Health financing has been cut across the country placing ever more demand on Red Crescent teams. Urgent international action is needed to support millions of people with the necessities of life as Afghanistan’s looming harsh winter threatens greater misery and hardships,” he said in Kabul today. Matheou warns that with winter approaching, and severe

drought in parts of the country affecting food production, in addition the lack of food and funding for healthcare and other services, results in disaster, Matheou said. Money must be restored to pay for wages and services, reported Associated Press.

In a press conference today at the end of a four-day visit, he urged, “There needs to be some solution to the financial flows into Afghanistan to ensure that at least salaries can be paid, and that essential supplies, power and water being two of them, can be procured.” To date, 2,500 health care facilities have shut down for of funding, and 20,000 staff, 7,000 of them women, aren’t being paid. He stressed, “We put the preservation of life first.”

GREEN NEW DEAL

The Queen’s Own Chatham House Says Military Will Enforce Green Dictatorship

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—In its latest tract on how to kill people and depopulate the globe, the British Crown’s premier policymaking think tank, the Royal Institute for International Affairs (RIIA)—known as Chatham House—on Sept. 29 published “[Building Global Climate Security](#),” arguing that since climate change poses such a serious threat to global security, it will now be necessary to rethink “traditional security concepts,” and understand the “interconnected demands” of climate security, sustainable human development and “regenerative economic systems.” These, the document affirms, are all needed to address “the most serious threat to global security we face.” The military is to play a major role here, so RIIA warns that military priorities must be changed. But, not to worry, because the security community has already advanced the “securitization agenda of climate change by recognizing climate change as a critical factor that militaries will have to deal with.” Climate change worsens “conflict environments,” you know, as Afghanistan, Mali, and the Tigray region of Ethiopia prove, and it is of course responsible for internal displacements and refugee migrations.

The message here is that the military—the “security community”—is going to play a major role in enforcing green fascism and depopulation with all that this implies in terms of violating sovereignty and intervening in nations’ internal affairs to defend the environment. Remember “responsibility to protect”? Chatham House enthusiastically maintains that since there are growing demands to legally define “ecocide” as a crime under the International Criminal Court, having the armed forces being called upon to defend against ecocide “looks increasingly likely.” Do nations damaging the environment get invaded? Chatham House suggests a scenario in which national law enforcement agencies might partner with militaries to defend the Amazon “and other key habitats” from destruction. But, then there is an even “more complex intervention,” such as “countering illegal wildlife trade.” The use of force? This could involve moving “directly against actors causing ecological damage or enforcing a mandate to protect shared ecological assets.”

The report complains about the lack of “climate finance” as a major obstacle to addressing climate change and building climate security. It makes no mention of Mark Carney, BlackRock, or the Davos crowd, but complains that the international community never came up with the \$100 billion promised in 2009 for climate finance to developing nations, “with only two months to go to COP26.” It recommends that world political leaders “leverage” the security risk posed by climate change in order to “increase ambition” around climate finance, and convince their constituencies that if more money is spent to tackle climate change, it will enhance national security and prevent “upstream conflict.” The options are limitless to build “regenerative security,” Chatham House crows. Starting with those countries that are leading on climate change, such as Great Britain and those of the EU, there’s nothing to prevent NATO from taking up the fight to develop a “regenerative security” agenda, and set an “example for defense and security forces around the world.”

Bankers Demand Industry Speed Up De-Carbonization

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—Some 220 banks and financial institutions, members of the international [Carbon Disclosure Project](#) (CDP), have sent a letter to 1,600 select major industrial companies urging them to speed up and detail their commitment to carbon emission reduction. Most of these companies have signed on to the emissions target, but so far not revealed details or timetables. The letter was based on so-called “research” by an outfit called the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi) run by figures from the UN Global Compact, World Wildlife Fund (WWF), CDP, World Resources Institute, and founded by Alberto Carrillo Pineda, CDP’s Director of Science Based Targets.

The banking side includes Lazard Frères Asset Management, Crédit Agricole, Allianz SE, Union Investment, and Fidelity International. The financial signers of the letter control a combined property of \$29.3 trillion.

The recipients of the letter—who collectively are worth \$41 trillion—include Anhui Conch Cement, China’s biggest cement manufacturer, Hyundai Motor Company, Duke Energy, Associated British Foods, Nippon Steel, Tata Steel, Lufthansa, BASF, Evonik, Vonovia, and Samsung.

HAITI

***EIR* Publishes ‘The Schiller Institute Plan To Develop Haiti’**

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—Today, *Executive Intelligence Review* (EIR) posted, “[The Schiller Institute Plan To Develop Haiti](#),” a 16-page report, which presents a comprehensive program addressing “eight fundamental areas of infrastructure, industry, and agriculture, which are at the core of the Haitian economy ... present[ing] what capabilities and what problems exist, along with recommended development plan solutions.” Those areas are 1. Power and Electricity, 2. A Universal Health Care System, 3. Hunger and Agriculture, 4. Railroads and Roads, 5. Airports and Seaports, 6. Sanitation and Water Purification, 7. Industry and Labor Force, and 8. Education.

The full report is the cover story of *EIR*'s October 1, 2021 issue, the lead in the section "[I. International: Anti-Malthusian Resistance.](#)"

The Schiller Institute Plan is clear in the mandate, and the urgent necessity of acting now:

“The task of rebuilding Haiti is a daunting one because of the level of destruction deliberately imposed on it by two centuries of Malthusian policies. Every sector of its physical economy must be rebuilt from the bottom up, to uplift its impoverished population. But it’s not an impossible task if China and the U.S. collaborate along with other nations of the Caribbean Basin and Central America, as part of an expanded Belt and Road Initiative and Maritime Silk Road throughout the region.

“Haiti will have to establish diplomatic relations with China: It is still one of the few countries in the world that maintains diplomatic relations instead with Taiwan. China rightly insists that it will only work with nations that recognize the principle of One China, and Haiti would be wise to follow the path taken by its neighbor, the Dominican Republic—which recently broke with Taiwan and established ties with China—if it is to have any hope of attaining Chinese participation in its reconstruction.

“Haiti has been repeatedly subjected to an intentional depopulation policy every time a ‘natural disaster’ strikes the country. For 125 years, the looting of Haiti by the City of London, Wall Street, and other Trans-Atlantic banks (France is key among them), joined in the 20th Century by the International Monetary Fund and other multilateral lending agencies, has denied it the right to develop into a modern nation, leaving it defenseless in the face of repeated disasters, the August 14, 2021 earthquake being only the most recent one.

“The Schiller Institute program for the rebuilding and reconstruction of Haiti, the initial outlines of which are presented below, includes a unified infrastructure plan, financed by a Hamiltonian system of ample directed credit, created as a central feature of a bankruptcy reorganization of the disintegrating international financial system. The Schiller Institute has estimated preliminarily that a viable Haiti reconstruction program will cost

between \$175 and \$200 billion, or \$17.5 to \$20 billion per year over ten years.”

The report also reviews the scuttled 2017 Haitian-Chinese \$4.7 billion project to rebuild Haiti’s capital, in which “two Chinese companies—the Southwest Municipal Engineering and Design Research Institute of China (SMEDRIC), and the Metallurgical Corporation of China (MCC)—outlined a series of detailed projects valued at \$4.7 billion to carry out the rebuilding of the capital and its environs. SMEDRIC indicated that the projects for Haiti’s capital were part of a broader, \$30 billion proposal for the whole country, discussed at the May 14-15, 2017, Belt and Road Initiative summit in Beijing. A short time after that, a Chinese delegation carried out an 8-day investigative visit to Haiti and met with local officials.”

The Schiller Institute Manhattan Project previewed the report on Sept. 25 in an international webinar, “[Reconstructing Haiti Is America’s Way Out of the ‘Global Britain’ Trap.](#)” With the intent of bringing together the forces to make reconstruction happen, the webinar featured the Schiller Institute Plan and required emergency action, with experts in engineering, medicine, and development policy, who all had ties to Haiti to discuss the plan. Their deliberation starkly contrasts events of the past weeks, that include the U.S. forced deportation of thousands of displaced Haitians from the Texas-Mexico border to Haiti, where they face disaster conditions from the August 2021 earthquake and Tropical Storm Grace, and the January 12, 2010 earthquake and subsequent cholera epidemic.

The six panelists were Richard Freeman, co-author of “The Schiller Institute Plan To Develop Haiti”; Eric Walcott, Director of Strategic Partnerships, Institute of Caribbean Studies; Firmin Backer, head of the Haiti Renewal Alliance; Joel DeJean, engineer and Texas-based LaRouche political organizer; and Dr. Walter Faggett, MD, Co-Chairman of the Health Council of the D.C.’s Ward 8 and former Chief Medical Officer of the District of Columbia; he is also an international leader with the Committee for the Coincidence of Opposites; and Manhattan Project Dialogue moderator Dennis Speed.

Firmin Backer pointed out that the State Department's USAID has spent \$5.1 billion in Haiti over the 11 years since the 2010 earthquake, but asked, what is there to show for it? Now, with the latest earthquake on Aug. 14, we can't even get aid into the stricken zones, because there is no airport or port in southern Haiti to serve the stricken people. We should reassess how wrongly the U.S. funding was spent. Firmin reported how the IMF gave Haiti some debt cancellation years back, but then disallowed the country from seeking foreign credit!

Eric Walcott was adamant. "We need the creative genius of the world to bear on Haiti and Afghanistan." He said to "leverage the diaspora" to develop Haiti. There are more Haitian physicians in New York and Miami than in all of Haiti. He stressed that Haiti is not poor; the conditions are what is poor. But the population has pride, talent, and resourcefulness. Walcott made a special point about elections in Haiti: "Elections are a process," not an event. He has experience. From 1998 to 2000, Walcott served as the lead observer for the Organization of American States for elections in Haiti.

Joel DeJean, an American of Haitian lineage, was forceful about the need to aim for the highest level in that nation, for example, to leapfrog from charcoal to nuclear power. He advised, "give China the opportunity" to deploy the very latest nuclear technology in Haiti—the pebble-bed gas-cooled modular reactor. We "don't need more nuclear submarines, we need nuclear technology!" He called for the establishment of a development bank in Haiti, and other specifics.

Dr. Faggett summed up at many points, with the widest viewpoint and encouragement of action. He served in the "Caribbean Peace-Keeping Force," and was emphatic about taking action not only in Haiti, but worldwide. He referenced President Franklin Delano Roosevelt, saying that "you can tell a lot about people, by how they take care of the health of their people." He reported that, at present, aid workers in Haiti are having to shelter in place, because of the terrible conditions.

But, he said, we should mobilize. Have “vaccine diplomacy,” and work to build a health platform in Haiti, and a health care delivery system the world over. He is “excited about realizing Helga’s mission,” referring to Schiller Institute Chairwoman Helga Zepp-LaRouche, who urged in June 2020 for a world health security platform. At that time, she and Dr. Joycelyn Elders, former U.S. Surgeon General, formed the Committee for the Coincidence of Opposites.

UNITED STATES POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC

Sleazy Pompeo Attacks Journalist Isikoff To Defend Himself

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—Former CIA Director Mike Pompeo (2017-18), whom Yahoo News exposed in a lengthy article as planning to kidnap and possibly assassinate Julian Assange, responded in an interview with conservative talk show host Glenn Beck by attacking Yahoo News journalist Michael Isikoff, as a “big Russiagate hoax perpetrator.” Unmentioned by either Pompeo or Beck is that Pompeo, after receiving a briefing at President Trump’s direction in October 2017 by whistleblower Bill Binney, former NSA Technical Director, in which Binney presented him evidence that there had been no Russian hack of the Democratic National Committee, did nothing to expose the Russiagate hoax. Though Pompeo asked Binney if he would meet with NSA and FBI officials to present his analysis, to which readily Binney agreed, there was no follow-up by Pompeo. Instead, his spokesman said, “The Director stands by, and has always stood by, the January 2017 Intelligence Community Assessment,” which accused Russia of hacking DNC computers.

In the interview with Beck, Pompeo did not exactly refute the Yahoo News story, for which Isikoff was a co-author. While saying that he and Trump were often accused of being engaged in “crazy things,” he admitted that “we were very worried about the fact that we had bad actors ... stealing very sensitive things,” referring to Assange and WikiLeaks. His comment implies that Trump was in on the discussions of kidnapping and assassination of Assange, which the Yahoo authors were unable to confirm.

He later told journalist Megyn Kelly that those who were sources for the Yahoo story “should all be prosecuted for speaking about classified activity inside the Central Intelligence Agency.”

NEW WORLD ECONOMIC ORDER

U.S. Must Break with British Geopolitics, Celani Tells Pakistan TV

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—*EIR*’s Claudio Celani participated in a PTV News debate yesterday, on “The U.S. Blame-Game against Pakistan,” together with analyst Prof. Riffat Hussain and Turkey’s TRT World Kabul correspondent Hasan Abdullah. Moderator Faisal Rehman asked about the proposal by U.S. Senators to investigate Pakistan’s role in the American debacle in Afghanistan, and its consequences. Celani explained that it comes from members of the U.S. pro-war faction who do not want to accept President Joe Biden’s decision to withdraw U.S. troops from Afghanistan. The sponsor of the bill, Sen. James Risch (R-ID), is on record pushing for sanctions on Syria, which shows that he has no consideration for human rights and the suffering of entire populations.

Celani explained that this U.S. faction does not want to give up regime-change wars, contrary to what the President has expressed. The British, who have dominated U.S. foreign policy through their geopolitical thinking, are particularly upset, as former British Prime Minister Tony Blair’s reaction shows. They and their allies in the U.S. establishment fear that the British Empire’s “special relationship” in the U.S. is endangered.

The Biden team wants to go back to diplomacy in foreign policy, but they must abandon British geopolitical thinking; otherwise, the danger of a war by miscalculation will not disappear. This is visible in the next step taken by the U.S., the formation of the AUKUS military alliance with Britain and Australia, targetting China.

The Schiller Institute is active worldwide and especially in the U.S. to influence a shift in the right direction, Celani said.

Hasan Abdullah fixated on the bad image of Pakistan painted by Indian media, whereas Professor Hussain raised the issue of the U.S. military-industrial complex, but expressed confidence that the action by the Republican senators will fail.

Islamabad's Ambassador in Kabul Says Extending CPEC to Afghanistan Will Expand Development

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—In an interview with Reuters published Sept. 27, the Pakistani Ambassador to Afghanistan Mansoor Ahmad Khan reported that extending the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) to Afghanistan, as part of the Belt and Road Initiative, is a topic of discussion between the two countries, and pointed out that it would be an excellent way of expanding “regional connectivity.” CPEC, he explained, “provides good opportunities, good potential for providing infrastructure and energy connectivity between Afghanistan and Pakistan... [and] also connecting South Asia to the Central Asian region.” According to Khan, discussion with the Taliban has focused on CPEC, which is a flagship project of the Belt and Road, and on other ways of developing the Afghan economy.

“I think there has been deep interest in terms of developing economic connectivity of Afghanistan with Pakistan through CPEC and with other neighboring countries, including Iran, China, and Central Asian countries,” he told Reuters. The ambassador also mentioned the importance of meetings that took place in Kabul Sept. 21-22 among the special envoys from Pakistan, China, and Russia, with Taliban officials, as well as with former President Hamid Karzai and Abdullah Abdullah, head of the Council of National Reconciliation under the previous government. Discussion focused on security and economic development, and Khan said that the three nations would continue to consult “as a group” and continue to meet with Taliban leaders. He explained that Pakistan is working with the international community to ease international restrictions imposed on Kabul, which sanctions and asset freezing have prevented conducting business in dollars.

COVID AND FAMINE

Cuba Produces Enough COVID Vaccine for Its Entire Population, and Exports to Venezuela, Iran, and Vietnam

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—Cuba has now produced all the vaccine doses it needs to fully inoculate its population by the end of this year, announced President Eduardo Martinez of the BioCubaFarma biotechnology firm. Cuban daily *Granma* reported on Sept. 22 his remarks that Cuba's vaccine production strategy had worked. "Based on our abilities, we were able to develop more than one vaccine, and we produced the doses we needed in record time, under difficult conditions." The country's biotechnology firms, including the Finlay Vaccine Institute, the Center for Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering, the Molecular Immunology Center, and the National Center for Biological Products, among others, joined forces to produce the Soberana 1, Soberana 2, Abdala, and Soberana Plus vaccines.

To date, Cuba has inoculated almost 40% of its population, and also recently announced that it had vaccinated 1.6 million children and adolescents with their first dose of Soberana 2, some 900,000 of them between the ages of 2 and 11. Dr. Vicente Verez Bencomo, director of the Finlay Institute, reported to *Granma* that clinical trials in children had gone very well, that just two doses of vaccine produced better results than in adults. He stressed, that the vaccine was specifically designed for children.

Cuba has begun the process of getting the World Health Organization's approval for its vaccines, but has already signed contracts and sent the Abdala vaccine to Iran, Venezuela, and Vietnam. Talks with Argentina on purchase of the vaccine "are advanced," *Granma* reported. And many other developing nations have indicated interest in obtaining the vaccines.

A Policy Shift Is Urgent! Panama's Foreign Minister Warns that 65,000 More Migrants Already Heading to U.S.

Sept. 30 (EIRNS)—Panamanian Foreign Minister Erika Mouynes reported this Sept. 28, that tens of thousands of migrants—including many Haitians, but from other countries as well—are already moving up through Central America and Mexico towards the United States, with around 30,000 more

already waiting on the Colombian border to enter Panama on their way north. “This is the beginning of something.... What we can say now is, that by the numbers we see, [immigration] is going to increase,” she warned.

What she described happening in the Americas, is what has been seen in the Mediterranean, in Central Asia, in Africa, as the old imperial order dies. This horror, of tens of millions of families forced to move all over the world from country to country, risking their lives solely to find some place to live a human life, can only be stopped with the kind of global paradigm-shift which the Schiller Institute has detailed in multiple reports.

“Something must be done—not doing anything is not an option,” Foreign Minister Mouynes stated. What is needed is “a shared solution for this migratory wave, which involves migrants of African, Caribbean, Cuban, Haitian, and other nationalities,” who have often already traveled long distances through several South American nations, by the time they arrive at Panama’s southern border. “When we receive them on the Panamanian side, they are malnourished. The children are in terrible condition, so even getting them up to a healthy state takes time,” she said.

More people crossed through the dangerous jungles of Panama’s Darién Gap in the month of August than in all of 2019—nearly 27,000, her government estimates. There would have been many more, but Panama tries to enforce a quota system, so that it is able to provide those who make it through the Darién Gap with some food and medical attention.

Mouynes spoke from Washington, D.C., where she had come for two days of meetings with State Department and National Security Council officials, and as many Members of Congress as possible, to wake up the U.S. capital to the urgency of coordinating policy for handling these waves of migrants with the other countries of the Americas.

She specifically added that the international community must help Haiti “face the humanitarian and political crisis which it is going through,” but in her remarks to the press, at least, she only spoke of “coordinating” so as to humanely “manage” these waves of people moving through, while actually stopping such inhumane conditions requires a total change in global policy.
