### **One Humanity for Peace: An Idea Whose Time Has Returned!**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—As organizer Cynthia Rush reported from our August 6 worldwide mass intervention carried out yesterday, “Humanity

for Peace events held in several Ibero-American (and Asian, African, European, etc.) locations yesterday, even the smallest ones, were characterized by optimism and a fierce commitment to ‘reason and truth,’ as one Dominican friend described it, on behalf of One Humanity.” That report, which along with several other reports that will be covered in *Executive Intelligence Review*, represent the major new development of world strategic importance in the international situation.

More than that, it represents the successful return, in principle, of the trans-Atlantic world to the conceptual platform of a “dialogue of civilizations” as opposed to a “clash of civilizations” barbaric perspective, an inhuman, Malthusian “trans-valuation of all values” perspective. While this by no means signifies that we have yet done more than establish a strong beachhead for the battle before us, like the Allied forces that landed in Normandy in World War II, we have nonetheless established a moral foothold—resurrecting the nearly-forgotten (in the West) idea of “One Humanity.” By this means, we can connect our own, ever-increasing forces to those, already fighting for humanity’s victory in many parts of Africa, Asia and Ibero-America, and who are standing, despite the City of London and Wall Street, against the opposite, murderous tide.

Helga Zepp-LaRouche’s reflections on this process are the natural lead of today’s report. As she assessed the international Humanity for Peace rallies in discussion with associates today: “I think we all did a pretty good job with the international rallies over the weekend, which altogether I would say represent a major breakthrough, because it is very clear that it is our movement which is leading this whole effort. People are really very eager to take up ideas which the peace movement so far did not have, at least not in any organized fashion, and that is the idea of how we get out of the war danger for good, because we are not just organizing against the war: We are trying to get a peace for eternity, forever. And people who were at the rally, people who were at the concert or listened to the concert, all got this idea that we are really shaping history. If anybody can do it at this very late hour, it is our effort. I think it was extremely inspiring. We are clearly now in a position to use what we have accomplished with the

rallies to go into the next phase, which is that we have to absolutely make sure that every person and every organization on the planet who wants to have peace, and who knows what is at stake, finds out about this. So, I would really think that we should be able to mobilize ... to map out all organizations on the planet ... to put peace on the table for sure.”

We also note that Russian economist Sergei Glazyev posted the Schiller Institute document “[Some LaRouche Essentials for Transition to a New International Financial System](#)” on his Telegram page. “Helga LaRouche, who sent this memorandum, continues the work of her husband, a great thinker-economist, who more than a quarter of a century ago predicted the inevitable collapse of the dollar monetary system,” Glazyev says. “LaRouche’s famous crocodile—the diverging curves of global GDP growth and the capitalization of the U.S. financial system—has only opened its jaws wider since then, devouring real values in exchange for the issuance of unsecured dollars.”

Glazyev’s colorful identification of the LaRouche “[Triple Curve](#)” function as the mouth of a crocodile, will hopefully spur interest among those bold enough to wish to engage Russia in the same way as did President John F. Kennedy. That would mean resolving fundamental questions of war and peace, through realizing that physical-economic development, resulting in greater potential relative population density—more people on Earth, living at a higher standard of living, deploying more energy, not less, and more efficiently, provided by far more powerful nuclear and thermonuclear-based technologies, all leading to ordered economic development, rather than exploitation, is the natural condition of peace. Sunday, August 6, in the name of those killed in Hiroshima, and all those unnecessary deaths in all wars, our one humanity took a certain, true worldwide step in this campaign.

### Glazyev Republishes Memo on ‘LaRouche Essentials for Transition to a New International Financial System’

### Italian Economist Geraci Recommends To Solve Migration from Africa via European Cooperation with China

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—[Michele Geraci](#), former Undersecretary of State in the Italian Ministry of Economics (and who addressed the July 8-9 Schiller Institute conference in Strasbourg, France) has written a tweet, saying: “The migrant crisis in Europe will not be solved by the distribution of arrivals these months. Already 100,000 seems like a lot, but it is nothing compared to the flows that will arrive in the coming years when Africa’s population will grow from the current 1.5 billion to 4 billion....

“Income differential(s), (and) political and social instability in some African countries exacerbates the situation. The different ethnicities and

difficulties of integration into different social systems combined with the intensity of expected flows will make the process unmanageable. Insisting on “distribution in Europe” does not address the real problem; in fact, it gives the illusion of having solved it, exacerbating it.

“The #ViaDellaSeta [Belt and Road Initiative/New Silk Road] and cooperation in Africa with those who are already there with heavy investment (#China), is one of the few ways to solve the real problem at its root. But other infrastructure and transportation development initiatives are also welcome; indeed, there is so much to do in Africa that there is room for everyone.

“However, China does, (and) has already ... invested hundreds of billions, I repeat, hundreds of billions since 10 years ago, while the EU Plan, the #GlobalGateway is zero. Words. With words you don't solve problems. Believe me.

“If you really want to stop the flow of #migrants from #Africa, then the question for #Meloni whether or not to stay in the #ViaDellaSeta is a foregone conclusion....

“PS: Already the fact Italy's entry into the Silk Road has been criticized by some members of competing governments in Europe, journalists etc., should be indicative that Italy has done well.”

## **Türkiye Strives for Peace in Ukraine, Revival of Black Sea Grain Deal**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan, addressing a conference of Turkish ambassadors in Ankara today, stressed that Türkiye will remain determined to end the fighting, and bring peace, between Russia and Ukraine. “We will stubbornly and persistently continue to strive for the end of the Ukraine war and the establishment of peace,” he said, reported Anadolu Agency. Türkiye's main priority will be to preserve calm in the Black Sea region and block attempts to jeopardize it, Fidan stressed. “We will continue our contacts with all parties for the revival of the Black Sea Grain Initiative, which affects every household in the world,” said Fidan, stressing that Türkiye is “the only actor that can do this.”

Earlier, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan had convened his cabinet which, Turkish news outlets reported, aimed to discuss potential solutions to reinstate the agreement, and that details of Erdogan's phone call with Putin on Aug. 2 regarding the matter would also be shared. According to the *Hurriyet Daily News*, Fidan had engaged in significant phone calls with his U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba in an effort to extend the crucial grain deal.

A diplomatic source in Istanbul told TASS that resumption of the grain deal will be the main topic in potential talks between Erdogan and Putin. "Obviously, one of the main issues during the Russian President's potential visit [to Türkiye] will be the revival of the grain deal. Progress in this area will make it possible to prevent further growth of grain prices after the suspension of the implementation of the Istanbul agreements. The current situation affects the countries most in need of agricultural products, and this problem should be solved in parallel with Russia's questions to the parties to the deal," the source said, adding that Ankara expects to reach an agreement with Moscow.

At the same time, he did not answer what concrete proposals for the resumption of the agreement the Turkish side is discussing with representatives of the UN, Russia and Ukraine. In his opinion, a positive outcome of the situation would strengthen the authority of Ankara and Moscow in Africa and Asia.

### **Russian Foreign Ministry Spokeswoman Says Kiev Covering Up Illegal Organ Trade**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova has alleged that members of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's administration are engaged in and covering up illicit export of human organs. Zakharova's assertions were published today in the government daily *Rossiyskaya Gazeta*, in an article, "[The World Leader of Black Transplants: In Ukraine, Organs Are Traded Online and Offline.](#)"

Zakharova begins by outlining the organ trafficking history in Ukraine:

“Ukraine has long been known as a world leader in organ trafficking. Scandals involving the illegal removal of organs from corpses began to appear in the late 1990s in the wake of the country’s socio-economic deterioration.

“The problem began to mount in the early 2000s, and the violent coup in Kiev in February 2014 and the ensuing conflict in Donbass were an additional contributing factor. In 2014, the OSCE stated that corpses with removed internal organs had been found in mass graves in areas where fighting was taking place. Most probably, they were victims of black-market transplant specialists.

“Organ trafficking increased in scale after the start of the Russian special military operation in Ukraine, following the Kiev regime’s passage of laws that drastically simplified the work of transplant specialists in the country.”

Zakharova then details how changes removed the need to notarize the written consent or authenticate the signature of a living donor to give up their organs, as well as exemptions for transplants from value-added tax. She then said that “criminals are making active use of this ‘most favored nation’ status,” adding that “trade in organs is conducted through the darknet and beyond.”

“It has been reported in the media that organs of killed soldiers of the Ukrainian Armed Forces were available for sale in one of the biggest shops of the darknet. A heart, liver, kidneys and other body parts with price tags starting at €5,000 are on offer.”

Zakharova then portrays the networks involved in organ trafficking and says, “there is information pointing to the involvement of Zelenskyy’s entourage.” She also said, “there is information indicating that in June 2023, representatives of the health ministry of a NATO country agreed with the Ukrainians on the delivery of a refrigerated train car with human organs and body parts that are most often used for transplants—corneas, some bones, connective tissues, hearts and livers.

“Ukraine was represented by ‘private businessmen’ who were assisted by people from Ukraine’s Health Ministry and the Presidential Office.”

She concludes: “To those who say it’s not possible, recall that Ukraine has legalized the posthumous donation and sale of organs abroad. What is strange is that members of Zelenskyy’s team are not interested in making this information public even though they made the decision themselves. Experts explain that in most cases, Ukrainian businessmen cannot specify the exact origin of the biomaterial scheduled for delivery. They believe a great deal of it comes from black market transplant specialists that illegally remove organs from the dead bodies of soldiers. Then they simply burn unclaimed remains. These conclusions are confirmed by the high death rate and large number of missing Ukrainian soldiers, as well as by the shortage of specialists and reagents for studying corpses on the territory controlled by the Kiev regime. This allows these criminals to cover their tracks and send human organs and body parts to the western regions of Ukraine, where they are prepared to be sent abroad for transplants.”

## STRATEGIC SHOWDOWN

### **Ukraine Rejects Negotiations and Will Pursue Zelenskyy ‘Peace Plan’ to the Last Ukrainian**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—The adviser to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy’s adviser Mykhailo Podolyak announced today that Kiev will stick to its “peace formula” and reject all compromise positions. In a tweet, Podolyak, who is officially an adviser to the head of the presidential office, said that Zelenskyy’s peace plan is “the only basic ‘foundation for negotiations,’ ” adding: “There can be no compromise positions such as ‘immediate ceasefires’ and ‘negotiations here and now’ that give Russia time to stay in the occupied territories. Only the withdrawal of Russian troops to the 1991 border.”

Several hours later, Podolyak tweeted:

“Any scenario of a ceasefire and freezing of the war in Ukraine in the current disposition will mean only one thing—Russia’s actual victory and

Putin’s personal triumph.... This would be a great defeat for the Western world and the end of the current global security order.”

Podolyak also referred to Russia’s alleged occupation of the Donetsk, Lugansk, Zaporozhye and Kherson regions, which actually joined the Russian Federation—and even Crimea—in an obvious and blatant provocation to Russia. He also claimed that Moscow would only use a “Minsk 3” to rearm and prepare for the “next round” of war, which would return “bigger, bloodier, and better prepared” as soon as “political leaders in key Western countries change,” reported in RT.

Podolyak also said in this tweet from Aug. 7: “There can be no negotiation process in the current disposition. The status quo must be changed on the battlefield. This means ... more weapons, missiles and aircraft.”

Podolyak’s comments should be seen in the context of this past weekend’s dialogue in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, where proposals for a settlement to the conflict in Ukraine were put forward. Whatever veracity there may have been to earlier media reports that raised hopes that Kiev’s stance was softening, the now-apparent reversal of that, indicated by Podolyak’s hard line, shows that Ukraine was either “only fooling” in the first place in discussions with Jeddah participants, feigning that they were actually leaning toward rationality, or that Ukraine was, perhaps, once again the recipient of another Boris Johnson unannounced “Mafia friendly advice” non-diplomacy session.

### **Türkiye’s Erdogan Renews Mediation Role for Peace in Ukraine**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—Citing a source in the Turkish government, Russian news agency RIA Novosti reports that Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan intends to offer himself once again as a mediator to resolve the conflict in Ukraine. (He had served in this role with some success in March 2022, before British Prime Minister Boris Johnson intervened with Kiev to sabotage the process.) It is expected that Erdogan will move forward with his plans at his upcoming face-to-face meeting with Russia’s President Putin. Erdogan’s office had stated on Aug. 2 that Putin would

visit Erdogan shortly, and the Kremlin confirmed as much, though the date had not yet been set.

Erdogan plans, according to RIA Novosti, to reiterate “the thesis that there will be no winners in the war, and no losers in the peace process.” A ceasefire is to be called, followed by negotiations. The source explained that Erdogan was “the only world leader” who enjoys the “sincere trust” of both Putin and Ukrainian President Zelenskyy. He has kept in regular touch with both.

### **Settler Violence Worrying Israeli Security Officials**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—Security officials in Israel are getting more concerned about the problem of Jewish settler violence. Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari, top spokesman for the Israeli Defense Forces, warned this morning that settler violence is spurring more Palestinian violence. Speaking with Ynet news site during a live broadcast, Hagari said that amid a rise in Palestinian terrorism in the West Bank in recent months, “there has also been an increase in nationalist crime and nationalist terror.”

“It’s terrorism, there’s no other way to say it,” said Hagari, reported the *Times of Israel*. “Let there be no doubt, these things spur the civilian [Palestinian] population to terror. The nationalist crime and nationalist terror ... push civilians in the Palestinian Authority who are not involved in terror—to terror,” he said. “This phenomenon needs to be addressed. As soon as this phenomenon is avoided, there will be less terrorism in general,” Hagari added.

Hagari was speaking following the arrest of two settlers on Aug. 4 for the killing of a 19-year-old Palestinian man. The settlers are claiming self-defense, but the government indictment accuses them of “deliberate or depraved-indifference homicide” with a racist motivation. The U.S. State Department strongly denounced the killing in a statement issued Aug. 5. “We strongly condemn yesterday’s terror attack by Israeli extremist settlers that killed a 19-year old Palestinian,” the statement said, urging “full accountability and justice.”

Settler violence against Palestinians in the West Bank has been surging since Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's coalition took power at the end of December. Citing official statistics, *Times of Israel* reports that there had been 680 incidents of stone-throwing or assaults against Palestinians by settlers in the first six months of 2023, compared to 950 in all of 2022. This includes 25 "serious attacks" involving arson against homes and mosques, some of which resulted in Palestinian casualties, compared to the same number in all of 2023.

## U.S. POLITICAL & ECONOMIC

### **Biden Administration Hopes to Secure Anti-China Alliance at Camp David Summit**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—U.S. President Joe Biden will host Japanese Prime Minister Kishida Fumio and South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol, at Camp David in Maryland on Aug. 18. This is the first time that Biden has hosted national leaders at the historic White House country retreat, and various media have indicated this as a measure of the importance of securing "a new chapter" in the trilateral relationship among the U.S., Japan and South Korea. Undoubtedly, it is the latest attempt by the war hawks in the Biden administration to court these important Asian nations to join the next phase in the Anglo-American war against China. The meeting will also occur in the context of ongoing tensions surrounding North Korea and their recent launches of ICBMs, as well as the recent trip to Pyongyang to celebrate the end of the Korean War by Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu, and Communist Party of China Politburo member Li Hongzhong.

"At the summit, the leaders will celebrate a new chapter in their trilateral relationship as they reaffirm their strong bonds of friendship and the ironclad alliances between the United States and Japan, and the United States and the Republic of Korea," the White House wrote in a statement. "The three leaders will discuss expanding trilateral cooperation across the Indo-Pacific and beyond—including to address the continued threat posed

by the D.P.R.K. [North Korea] and to strengthen ties with ASEAN and the Pacific Islands.”

In the context of the summit, China’s *Global Times* editorialized yesterday: “[Camp David Summit Could Be Dangerous for Japan, South Korea.](#)” The editorial begins:

“Are the U.S., Japan and South Korea moving toward a security bloc similar to a military alliance? Such concerns are growing. On Aug. 18, U.S. President Joe Biden will invite the leaders of Japan and South Korea to attend the Camp David summit. It is said that Washington is pushing for a ‘historic joint statement,’ which may include plans to boost extended deterrence and economic security cooperation plans for ‘building a global supply chain.’ Ranging from defense to economy and other fields, the summit has not yet started, but the feeling of a cold war it reveals has spread, casting a shadow of camp confrontation in the Asia-Pacific region.”

*Global Times* also cites the White House, which said “the three leaders will celebrate a ‘new chapter in their trilateral relations,’ and the U.S. ambassador to Japan wrote on Twitter that the summit promises to make history, and ‘will lead to a strategic paradigm shift.’ ” The editorial board continue: “Some analysts believe that this summit is likely to mark the beginning of building a trilateral military cooperation system between the U.S., Japan and South Korea.” They also say that “on the surface, the U.S., Japan, and South Korea are under the banner of ‘countering North Korea’s growing nuclear threat,’ but in fact, it has always been U.S.’ desire to build a ‘mini-NATO-style’ trilateral military alliance in Northeast Asia.”

The *Global Times* editors make it clear that such an alliance is not guaranteed, writing, “whether the U.S., Japan, and South Korea can truly reach this stage is still unknown,” and continues by citing articles in South Korean media outlets, that suggest there is little benefit in joining such an alliance, and that South Korea could help in dialogue between China and Japan.

The editorial concludes: “However, regardless of the circumstances, this incoming summit is indeed pushing the Northeast Asian region toward a

new historic crossroads. On one side of the crossroads lies the continuation of the cooperation and prosperity in the Asia-Pacific region, along with the resolution of conflicts through true multilateralism to achieve common security. On the other side is the emergence of a trilateral military alliance, which will plunge the Northeast Asian region into a profound security trap and potentially alter the trajectory of its future development. Both Japan and South Korea are located in Northeast Asia, deeply integrated with the security and prosperity here. The path they choose will leave completely different footnotes in history. It is hoped that these two countries will carefully consider their actions before proceeding.”

## COLLAPSING WESTERN SYSTEM

### De-industrialization Threatening to Bring Down German System

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—In an article for today’s issue of *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung*, former German Economics Minister Sigmar Gabriel charges the elites of the country with a total lack of vision for solutions to the “big challenges of mankind,” like developing Africa in the tradition of J.F. Kennedy. Failing to offer such a vision himself, however, Gabriel warns that “should a protracted recession, the loss of central value-creation chains in the industry come to Germany, as the consequence of too rapidly pursued electrification under the banner of ‘green transformation,’ accompanied by an increase of unemployment, a perfect storm is threatening, which could demand more from the German democracy which is very stable in comparison with the rest of Europe, than has been the case in the past 80 years.”

“The past 80 years” takes us back to the 1944 Morgenthau Plan—the agenda of the Anglo-Americans for Germany’s de-industrialization after World War II, now being implemented under the guise of “saving the planet.”

### **‘Hiroshima, Nagasaki Bombings Were Needless, Said World War II’s Top U.S. Military Leaders’**

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—Writing on his website “[Stark Realities with Brian McGlinchey](#),” on Aug. 1 Brian McGlinchey takes on the ongoing justification of the use of atomic weapons in Japan, by citing U.S. military officials at the time, who disagreed with the horrific decision to use the bomb. McGlinchey otherwise provides a useful historical study of the process of negotiations at the time, and further makes the case that the terms of a Japanese surrender had already been agreed before the bombs were dropped—something that few authors outside of the *Executive Intelligence Review* have shown. It should be noted that McGlinchey had formerly run 28pages.org, which had played an important role in the campaign to declassify the “28 pages” of the Joint Inquiry into Intelligence Community Activities before and after the Terrorist Attacks of September 11, 2001, conducted by the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, which showed that the FBI knew of involvement by officials from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia organizing that terrorist activity.

McGlinchey’s piece in *Stark Realities* begins:

“The anniversaries of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki present an opportunity to demolish a cornerstone myth of American history—that those twin acts of mass civilian slaughter were necessary to bring about Japan’s surrender, and spare a half-million U.S. soldiers who’d have otherwise died in a military conquest of the empire’s home islands.

“Those who attack this mythology are often reflexively dismissed as unpatriotic, ill-informed or both. However, the most compelling witnesses against the conventional wisdom were patriots with a unique grasp on the state of affairs in August 1945—America’s senior military leaders of World War II.

“Let’s first hear what they had to say, and then examine key facts that led them to their little-publicized convictions” he writes; the following quotes are excerpted from McGlinchey’s piece.

General Dwight Eisenhower on learning of the planned bombings: “I had been conscious of a feeling of depression and voiced to [Secretary of War Stimson] my grave misgivings, first on the basis of my belief that Japan was already defeated and that dropping the bomb was completely unnecessary, and secondly because I thought that our country should avoid shocking world opinion by the use of a weapon whose employment was, I thought, no longer mandatory as a measure to save American lives. It was my belief that Japan was, at that very moment, seeking some way to surrender with a minimum loss of ‘face.’ ”

Admiral William Leahy, Truman’s Chief of Staff: “The use of this barbarous weapon ... was of no material assistance in our war against Japan. The Japanese were already defeated and ready to surrender because of the effective sea blockade and the successful bombing with conventional weapons.”

Major General Curtis LeMay, 21st Bomber Command: “The war would have been over in two weeks without the Russians entering and without the atomic bomb.... The atomic bomb had nothing to do with the end of the war at all.”

General Hap Arnold, U.S. Army Air Forces told an interviewer: “The Japanese position was hopeless even before the first atomic bomb fell, because the Japanese had lost control of their own air.” He wrote in his memoirs: “It always appeared to us that, atomic bomb or no atomic bomb, the Japanese were already on the verge of collapse.”

Ralph Bird, Under Secretary of the Navy: “The Japanese were ready for peace, and they already had approached the Russians and the Swiss.... In my opinion, the Japanese war was really won before we ever used the atom bomb.”

Brigadier General Carter Clarke, military intelligence officer who prepared summaries of intercepted cables for Truman: “When we didn’t need to do it, and we knew we didn’t need to do it ... we used [Hiroshima and Nagasaki] as an experiment for two atomic bombs. Many other high-level military officers concurred.”

Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz, Pacific Fleet commander: “The use of atomic bombs at Hiroshima and Nagasaki was of no material assistance in our war against Japan. The Japanese were already defeated and ready to surrender.”

## SCIENCE & INFRASTRUCTURE

### Successful U.S. Fusion Experiment

Aug. 7, 2023 (EIRNS)—The Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory National Ignition Facility (NIF) reported a very successful fusion experiment, one that repeated their landmark December 2022 experiment, but now with an even higher energy yield. “We have continued to perform experiments to study this exciting new scientific regime. In an experiment conducted on July 30, we repeated ignition...” stated NIF spokesman Paul Rhien. While they “won’t be discussing further details” until they have conducted more analysis, they were able to state for now: “Analysis of those results is underway, but we can confirm the experiment produced a higher yield than the December test.”
