LaRouche Leads from the Mountain-Top

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—The Schiller Institute conference, “The Age of Reason or the Annihilation of Humanity,” now transitions to a second phase. This will involve various forms of international actions, from demonstrations to “Zoom call teach-ins,” from letter-writing to lobbying. Most importantly, however, it will involve new, unexpected alliances, “coincidences of opposites” that will make people uncomfortable, in the way advocated by St. Paul: “Be not conformed to this world, but be ye transformed by renewing your mind.”

Remarks by Pope Francis regarding his quest for peace, during his return flight from South Sudan, and the Schiller Institute demand for the lifting of Caesar sanctions in the aftermath of the Türkiye-Syria earthquake (see below), flow from the same conceptual source, expressed in the words of Dr. Martin Luther King. “I refuse to accept the cynical notion that Nation after Nation must spiral down a militaristic stairway into the hell of thermonuclear destruction. I believe that unarmed truth and unconditional love will have the final word in reality. That is why right temporarily defeated is stronger than evil triumphant.”

When Lyndon LaRouche wrote his “How To Lick a Depression in a Single Day,” more than 51 years ago, in response to the taking of the dollar off the gold standard on August 15, 1971, he was responding to something that he had seen, and vowed to fight, that had begun more than a decade earlier. LaRouche identified this in an interview he gave on March 18, 1991, from his prison cell in Rochester, Minnesota:

“The policy issue is the same as it’s been for me, in fact, for 30 years, particularly 25 years: The United States, as I feared would be the case 30 years ago, is going fascist. And, not only is it going fascist, but it is headed toward establishing a fascist, one-world empire, which George Bush calls a new world order. That’s just his name for it.

“But I recall what I wrote back in 1961 for publication on this subject. And, since then—or, say, 1971, ten years later, the result of the Nixon crisis of October 1969, with the collapse of the gold reserve requirement and the introduction of what was called Phase I there, and the announcement of Phase II to come. This is pure fascism, economically in the sense that Hjalmar Schacht introduced fascism into Germany, or that Volpi di Misurata, who was the patron and financial minister for Benito Mussolini introduced fascism into Italy.

“What Bush is proposing—as Dukakis was actually proposing, in 1988—is fascism, domestically. And then, on a matching basis, what they’re proposing globally, as I feared ever since I saw the operation against the former Belgian Congo, against Lumumba, is the same thing in our policies toward the developing sector and other parts of the world. That for which we’ve been called conspiracy theorists, saying that there is an Anglo-American plot, so to speak, including the backers of Henry Kissinger, who is a self-admitted British agent, to establish an Anglo-American world empire, with the Soviets as, ostensibly, a junior partner. That’s all happening.

“Look at the world: it’s evil and desperate. Look at what’s happening to people in the United States. It’s an evil and desperate situation. People are terribly frightened. Fewer people are standing up to resist. *It is a moral obligation of all of us who will stand up to resist, who still have the courage to resist this evil, to stand up*, each in our own way, that is. The most effective way I can stand up inside the United States, is by running again for President.”

Note that the Lumumba assassination, a topic in the last two Schiller Institute conferences, played a central role in [Lyndon LaRouche](#)’s personal commitment to act, no matter what the cost to himself. It was this commitment which drove, and inspired, the continual breakthroughs by LaRouche on physical economy, leading to his 1990s proposal for a World Land-Bridge, a complement and higher statement of the principles of

economic development that undergird the Belt and Road Initiative. In a 1997 seminar, he said:

“The crucial thing, to all of these parts of the world, whether it’s Africa, South Asia, East Asia, is to provide to these sectors of the world, the right to development. The right to development involves education, infrastructure development, and, above all, the machine-tool design capability, without which you can not have continuous, sustainable development.

“You can not simply go into a barren desert, and set up a factory, and expect to have a productive economy. You must, first of all, provide infrastructure. You must provide economic transportation, water-management, power, and so forth. You must have educational systems, health systems: all of these infrastructural elements which are necessary for a successful modern economy in that locality. That is, you must measure the density of infrastructure, in terms of per capita of labor force, in terms of square kilometer of relevant area.

“This ability to transfer technology, and to develop it, depends upon the ratio, of the number of persons employed, productively, in a machine-tool-sector industry, to the total number of persons employed in the economy. That is: the ratio of the rate of technological progress, per capita, in the machine-tool sector, as compared with the projected rate of technological progress per capita in the labor force, as a whole.

“This is the key, the indispensable key, to economic progress: Without it, you can’t have it. Thus, that was the principle...: that, by developing land routes of efficient, high-rate, high-speed transportation, throughout Eurasia, and using these routes, not only to support trade and industry, but to support the transmission, at a high rate, of the machine-tool-design sector, into these countries, then and only then, would it be possible to lift the greatest part of the world population, which is concentrated in South and East Asia—and also in Africa, secondly—to lift these parts of the world, out of the legacy of 19th-century imperialism, and the legacy of second-class citizenship in world affairs.”

We will stop the self-destruction of civilization only by pursuing this narrow, “global” path. Luckily, Lyndon LaRouche always advised, and practiced, viewing things, as did Martin Luther King, from the mountain-top. Helga Zepp-LaRouche’s post-conference Monday discussion, featured here, outlines, using her Ten Principles, a single concept of intervention into the immediate conjuncture of global crises, by means of which humanity can supersede geopolitics, before geopolitics annihilates humanity.

Statement by the Schiller Institute on the Earthquakes

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—The recent double earthquake in southern Turkiye and northwestern Syria is a terrible disaster which is generating a wave of emotion and empathy from around the world. The situation will likely worsen due to forecast weather of extremely low temperatures throughout the region, resulting in the collapse of weakened buildings due to the cold and frost, not to mention the immediate consequences to children, women and men who have lost everything.

Time is of the essence. We welcome an international response; in fact there are several countries that have already offered their assistance to the populations affected by the earthquakes. This being said, it is difficult to accept that the same disaster has a very different human impact on either side of the borders of Turkiye and Syria. On the Syrian side, this tragedy is affecting a population that has been hard hit by years of war and sanctions imposed by the United States with other nations.

This situation confronts us, as Western nations, with our responsibility to uphold the values we claim to embody. Are we going to continue to

apply the measures that we very well know have led to the unimaginable suffering, misfortune and death of innocent people? Or are we going to finally make the decision to lift these criminal sanctions? Don't we know, after so many years of use, that the weapon of sanctions only hurts the people?

It is time for Western leaders to regain a minimum of moral fiber, by taking this tragedy as the opportunity to definitively lift all sanctions against Syria and, from then on, to organize the reconstruction of the country with those who are determined to contribute to it.

Pope Francis Reiterates He Wants To Meet with Putin and Zelenskyy for Peace

Feb. 6 (EIRNS)—Returning to Rome from South Sudan, after his visits to D.R. Congo and South Sudan, Pope Francis met with journalists on the plane, and the first question he was asked, by NBC News, was, “since your calls for peace haven't been answered,” did he still seek to meet with Russian President Vladimir Putin and Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, as he had “knelt before leaders of the Global South and begged them to stop fighting each other”? according to the report from NBC News.

Pope Francis replied: “If I have not gone to Kiev, it was because it was not possible at the time to go to Moscow; but I was in dialogue. In fact, on the second day of the war, I went to the Russian Embassy to say that I wanted to go to Moscow to talk to Putin, provided there was a small window to negotiate. Then Minister Lavrov replied that he was considering this but [said], ‘Let's see later,’ ” according to the Vatican News service transcription of the press dialogue.

The Pope continued, saying, “Today we are at this point, but it is not the only war. I would like to do justice [to what's happening around the world].... Yes, there are more important wars because of the noise they make, but ... the whole world is at war, and in self-destruction. We have to think seriously: it is in self-destruction. We must stop in time, because one bomb calls back on you a bigger one, and [then] a bigger one, and in the

escalation, you don't know where you will end up. We need to have a cool head.”

Senior Russian Diplomat Says Implementation of New START Treaty Affected by U.S. Policy Toward Russia and Ukraine

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov reported in a press conference in Moscow this morning, that when he met last week with Lynne Tracy, the new U.S. ambassador to Russia, the status of the New START nuclear arms reduction treaty was among the topics on their agenda. “We don't reveal the contents of closed consultations. What I can add to the short media statement that was released following the meeting with Ambassador Tracy is that we discussed the New START. The Americans later decided to make their claims on the matter public [likely referring to U.S. accusations made last week that Russia is in violation of the treaty by not allowing U.S. inspectors into Russia-ed.]. There was nothing unexpected or unusual about that signal for us,” Ryabkov said in response to a TASS question. He stressed that “the United States has made previous attempts to present all things related to the activities of the Bilateral Consultative Commission as a completely different issue that should be considered with no reference to the developments in Ukraine.”

“We view the situation around inspections in the same context as the issue of the next session of the Bilateral Consultative Commission. It's hard to imagine officers of the U.S. Armed Forces inspecting Russian military facilities,” he pointed out. “They would have traveled deep into our country while being the representatives of a party to the conflict (in Ukraine), albeit for purposes said to be connected with the need to verify the implementation of New START,” Ryabkov added.

In an interview with RIA Novosti, last week, Ryabkov had indicated that it is quite possible that there will be no arms control treaty between the U.S. and Russia after New START expires in 2026. “Unfortunately, during all recent years, Washington was guided by the principle that its egoistic interest is all that matters, while all the rest can be ignored,” he said. “This is why we were seeing a deliberate dismantling of the entire arms control

structure, including multilateral treaties, not just bilateral agreements with the Russian Federation. The New START treaty may also fall victim to this approach. We are ready for this scenario. We are considering it and its consequences, and we are thinking about what we should focus on to guarantee our security. However, we are not hiding that this is not our choice. It would be rational to take a different path—to resume the discussion of strategic stability and start working on a new security equation that would consider all factors affecting strategic stability.”

Ryabkov also stressed that there is no dialogue with the U.S. on anything— especially not on Ukraine. “We currently have no dialogue with the Americans on the subject of the special military operation, Ukraine, on any lines, except for communication between representatives of the Foreign Ministry and the State Department with the U.S. embassy in Moscow and the Russian embassy in Washington. Occasional phone calls at other levels take place, but no meetings, special formats for this kind of consultations are not held,” he said.

Bits of Rationality Coming Through the Madness about the Chinese Balloon

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—The airwaves in the U.S. may be totally dominated by madness regarding the Chinese weather balloon that President Biden ordered shot down by the U.S. Air Force last week. There is, nonetheless, a voice of reason that sticks out. James Flaten, a University of Minnesota professor who works with NASA to teach students using high-altitude balloons, told National Public Radio that it would be possible for a high-altitude balloon launched from China to reach the U.S., but added that China may not have had much control over its path at such high altitudes. “I’m not saying they’re telling the truth,” Flaten said, “I’m just saying that’s a plausible story.”

NPR notes that, though there’s been speculation that China sent the balloon over North America on purpose, some doubt that the country was trying to provoke the U.S. at the very moment Beijing was set to host Secretary of State Antony Blinken. “China has an interest in inserting some

more stability into the relationship,” Dave Shullman, senior director of the China Global Hub at the Atlantic Council, told NPR’s Weekend Edition.

COLLAPSING WESTERN SYSTEM

War Economy Resisted in Europe

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—A large demonstration of some 50,000 people gathered in front of the Danish Parliament today. Denmark is trying to abolish a holiday which dates back to 1686, known as National Prayer Day, because the government thinks that the extra tax revenue from making it a work day can be thrown into the military budget and help bring it up to 2% of GDP by 2030. The narrow majority coalition government, coveting \$542 million equivalent in extra military budget money, “says it intends to push the bill through regardless of any opposition,” according to Britain’s *Daily Mail*, which ran photos of the demonstration.

And Bloomberg reported that unnamed German officials told it the government is planning for “re-routing existing subsidies for eliminating coal-fired power plants, to help defense manufacturers build new production facilities.” No indication of protests against this yet.

G7 ‘Price Caps’ as Ineffective in Physical Economy as Other Sanctions on Russia

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—U.S. and G7 “price caps” are supposed to go into effect today on refined products of Russian oil, particularly diesel fuel and heating fuels. In line with the financial oligarchy’s “above reality” view of its own sanctions on Russia, Janet Yellen made a statement on Feb. 5 which chose to ignore the findings of the IMF and the Institute for International Finance, regarding growth having been restored in the Russian economy despite the “monster sanctions.” Yellen said, “The caps we have just set will now serve a critical role in our global coalition’s work to degrade Russia’s ability to prosecute its illegal war.”

Diesel, kerosene and gasoline will be “capped” at \$100/barrel; fuel oil, at \$45/barrel, by the G7. The European Union has a summit of finance

ministers scheduled this week, and is supposed to issue yet another round of sanctions, also focused, at least in part, on refined petroleum products.

Several oil analysts are quoted in an OilPrice.com story today to the effect that the crude oil price cap, like the other fossil fuel sanctions, have been completely circumvented by Russia and its trading partners in other countries. There has, however, been a drop in the Russian government's oil-related tax revenues in December, according to several reports, by about 45% relative to December 2021. But the government is moving to change the basis on which export fees are calculated, from one based on the price of Urals crude—recovered in eastern Russia and largely sold to the West—to one based on the much higher price of Brent crude, as a way to recover that revenue. The Siberian crude oil which Russia sells, through new pipelines and by ship, to the East, has held up in price similar to that of Brent crude, despite sanctions and price caps.

A new report in *The Economist* says volumes have also recovered. “Russia’s exports took a knock after Europe’s initial salvo in December,” it says. “Two months on, however, they have recovered to levels last seen in June. The volume of oil on water, which tends to climb when the market jams up, is back to normal. As expected, China and India are picking up most of the embargoed barrels. Yet there is a surprise: the volume of cargo with unknown destinations has jumped. Russian oil, once easy to track, is now being distributed through more shadowy channels.”

As to how this is done, *The Economist* report says: “We find, to the West’s chagrin and Russia’s relief, that the new ‘shadow’ shipping and financing infrastructure is robust and extensive. Rather than fade away, the grey market stands ready to expand when the next set of sanctions is enforced.”

Kiev Regime Scrambles over Defense and Security Positions

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—Today, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy submitted his nomination of Vasyl Malyuk to the unicameral Verkhovna Rada for ratification as head of Ukraine’s state security service, the SBU. Malyuk has been the acting head of SBU since mid-July, when Zelenskyy

suddenly dismissed his longtime collaborator, Ivan Bakanov, over charges of having hundreds of traitors in his SBU. On Feb. 1, Malyuk's SBU team carried out a series of raids against the notorious former Minister of Internal Affairs Arsen Avakov, and Zelenskyy's former patron, Ihor Kolomoisky. Malyuk has been connected in Ukrainian media with Oleg Tatarov, a powerful behind-the-scenes player, who is presently serving as the deputy head of the Office of the President.

The previous 24 hours in Kiev had witnessed some sort of power struggle. The parliamentary leader of Zelenskyy's "Servant of the People" party, David Arakhamia, had posted on his Telegram channel yesterday that Oleksii Reznikov would be replaced as the Minister of Defense by Kyrylo Budanov, the present head of the Defense Ministry's intelligence arm, GUR. Budanov, notably, had dropped a bombshell on Kiev three weeks ago, when he went public with the story of the SBU's execution on March 5, 2022 of Denys Kireyev, one of Kiev's peace negotiators, whom the Defense Ministry had identified as a GUR informant.

Over the next several days, a flurry of corruption charges broke out, including a Jan. 21 story involving massive graft. In particular, Reznikov's Defense Ministry was exposed to be grossly overpaying contractors for food. Zelenskyy Head of the Presidential Office Andriy Yermak then moved to protect Reznikov and himself. Arakhamia managed an appearance by Reznikov before the Verkhovna Rada, allowing Reznikov's questionable testimony, and leaving Reznikov's underling, Deputy Defense Minister Vyacheslav Shapovalov, to fall on his sword. Now, only two weeks later, Arakhamia is pushing Reznikov out.

[Arakhamia](#) wrote on his Telegram channel: "War dictates personnel policy. Time and circumstances call for strengthening and regrouping. This is happening now and will continue to happen in the future.

"Oleksiy Reznikov within the government is being transferred to the position of Minister for Strategic Industries to strengthen military-industrial cooperation, which is absolutely logical, given his expertise on 'Ramstein' and the need to "raise" the Ministry, which should do more.

“Major General Kyrylo Budanov will head the Ministry of Defense, which is absolutely logical for wartime.

“Ministry of Internal Affairs—Ihor Klymenko.

“SBU—Vasyl Malyuk.

“The logic is the same. Law enforcement agencies at this stage should be headed not by politicians, but by cadre law enforcement officers.

“The enemy is preparing to advance. We are preparing to defend ourselves and retake our own territory.”

But, [Reznikov](#) countered, telling Fakti website that there had to be some kind of “mistake”: “I repeat once again that the decision to fire the Minister of Defense or the Minister of Foreign Affairs can only be taken by the President, in accordance with the Constitution of Ukraine. The appointment to a new position in any ministry is, of course, discussed according to the law....

“I want to say as a lawyer that such a procedure of transfer within the government from minister to minister does not exist—this decision of the parliament can only be at the request of the prime minister.... If I suddenly received such an offer from the President of Ukraine or the Prime Minister, I would refuse it, because I do not have the expertise that would allow me to be the Minister of the Ministry of Strategic Industries. So I think it's a mistake.”

By this morning, Arakhamia changed his tune, [posting a reply](#) to his earlier Telegram post, saying: “We are waiting for the appointment of the heads of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Security Service of Ukraine. Personnel changes in the field of defense will not take place this week.”

Later in the day came Zelenskyy’s announcement that Malyuk’s status is to go from acting to permanent head of the SBU.

U.S./EU Sanctions, Terrorist War Impeding Earthquake Recovery in Syria

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—The destructive earthquake, measured at 7.8 Richter by the U.S. Geological Survey that hit southern Turkiye and northern Syria early this morning is underscoring the cruelty of the U.S. policy of regime change and economic sanctions on Syria. Independent journalist Vanessa Beeley, who resides in Damascus, told RT that Syrian emergency services have been suffering from the lack of supply of equipment because of the sanctions. As a result, “they are dealing with a disaster that is really beyond their capability.”

Beeley reported that sanctions have devastated the hospital systems “and rendered them incapable of providing certain medical operations, medical assistance.” Furthermore the U.S. military occupation of northeastern Syria means that no oil is going to western Syria, preventing the generation of electricity. There’s no shelter for people who have been made homeless, leaving many thousands out in a driving rainstorm, “so everything is being complicated by the conditions, by the remnants of the war, and most of all, by the sanctions,” she said. Not one Western country, reported Beeley, had stepped up to provide aid to Damascus to deal with the emergency, despite Syria’s appeal to the UN and international organizations to respond to the earthquake emergency.

Aid is coming to Syria from Russia, Iran, Iraq, the U.A.E., and Algeria, and perhaps others. The director of Syrian Civil Aviation told Sham Radio that landing permission has been granted for planes carrying humanitarian aid from the U.A.E., Russia and India. Russian President Vladimir Putin made phone calls this afternoon to both President of Syria Bashar al-Assad and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, offering them aid. Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu issued an order to the commander of the Russian Group of Forces in Syria to provide assistance in response to the earthquake. So far, according to a Russian Defense Ministry statement this morning, six humanitarian aid distribution posts in Aleppo, Hama, Jabla, Stamu, and Bustan al-Basha have been set up, and Russian personnel have formed 10 joint detachments tasked to remove debris, search for victims,

and provide them with medical aid in the mostly damaged areas. In addition, a mobile group of Russian military healthcare professionals, four blood donation posts, and a joint coordination headquarters have been established at Hmeimim Air Base to provide assistance to the Syrian side.

NEW STRATEGIC AND ECONOMIC ARCHITECTURE

Linke Party Leader Seeks European Security Architecture Beyond NATO

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—Co-chair of Germany’s Die Linke (Left) party, [Martin Schirdewan](#), said in an interview with *Der Spiegel* published on Feb. 5: “If we want stable peace we should find a way of interacting with Russia.”

“We have to get out of the military tunnel vision and move toward a diplomatic solution. Pressure must be built up on Vladimir Putin so that he is prepared to negotiate. The German government could play an important role in this—together with Brazil and China, for example—but it is not doing so because the Chancellor is being forced into the military” by government coalition partners, the Free Democrats and the Greens.

He further stated that the European Union should be independent from both Russia and the United States. However, according to him, even after the Ukrainian conflict, Russia would remain part of Europe. “This is why you should think about the post-war order,” he asserted, and that “it was difficult to do so right now.... We also should define security beyond NATO. Germany, being the largest economy in the EU, should urgently discuss with its European partners how to establish Europe’s security on its own.”

He stressed that Russia would respond positively to diplomacy: “We see with the grain agreement or the prisoner exchange that negotiations are possible,” Schirdewan affirmed, but saying that “when it comes to pressure on Putin, targeted sanctions against the power apparatus and oligarchs are needed.” He said that he “would prefer a democratic Russia without Putin. But if we want lasting peace, we have to find a way to deal with Russia. I

wish there were someone in the German government who would take this task seriously. For myself, I see no one there.”

Retired German Generals Oppose Tanks to Ukraine and Circulate Open Letters in France

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—Following Germany’s decision to send Leopard 2 tanks to Ukraine, two former German generals have made their thorough opposition known in open letters, in which they call on their former colleagues and on German citizens to do likewise. Formerly with the National Patriotic Army of the German Democratic Republic (East Germany), these generals support the wise words that former Bundeswehr Chief of Staff Gen. Harald Kujat and Chairman of U.S. Joint Chiefs Gen. Mark Milley express respecting the former Soviet Union’s fair attitude towards Germany at the end of World War II and following the Fall of the Wall; and at the same time, they turn to France seeking similar voices. This news agency has been told that their letters are circulating among military figures in France, and have also begun to appear on Internet sites there.

The retired officers are [Lt. Gen. Manfred Grätz](#) and Maj. Gen. Sebald Daum. At the end of his very strong statement Manfred Grätz calls on “all members and supporters of our association, my comrades and friends’ to mobilize. Raise your voice, do not hide. Write, in whatever form and by whatever means, and do not forget your name and rank. Seek out and find our allies, participate in their demonstrations as well. Together we are stronger. Take to the streets, if you are still fit and mobile. Talk to the people, despite the divergent interests represented there. Nobody wants war among the demonstrators.”

U.S. POLITICAL & ECONOMIC

Jimmy Dore Blasts Palantir as Intelligence Community Tool for Domestic Espionage

Feb. 6, 2023 (EIRNS)—Comedian podcaster [Jimmy Dore](#) launched a broadside on Feb. 5 against the cyber-ops company Palantir, the intelligence agency front started through invented billionaire Peter Thiel

and his Frankfurt School crony [Alex Karp](#), which is deeply involved in Ukraine military operations against Russia, but also runs large-scale psychological warfare “data mining” profiles for NATO clients.

In an eight-minute replay and commentary on a video of Karp being interviewed at the Jan. 18 World Economic Forum gathering—(Karp loves to indulge in interviews at the WEF haunt)—Dore named Karp a “CIA agent” deployed for global espionage and warfare. Posing the question, whether Palantir would also be used for espionage “on Americans,” Dore characterized the cyber warfare company as running the “shadiest government operations in decades.”

Dore also highlighted an aspect of Palantir’s history which was prominently reported in 2012, but which has since disappeared from media: two leading paid consultants for the company at that time were former Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, and General David Petraeus.

A maniacal braggart, Karp boasted in the interview that a single software program designed by the firm “stopped the far right in Europe,” and seized control over the “COVID narrative.” With respect to Ukraine, where Karp was the first Western chief executive officer of an international corporation to meet face to face with Volodymyr Zelenskyy last year, Karp bragged Palantir can “hone in on adversaries over a whole country,” blather for boasting that their digital programs are being used in the military attacks on Russia.

A guest on the show noted how Karp and Thiel exemplify “the danger of neo-Liberals,” who don’t hesitate to use, even in the U.S., the same digital profile techniques “Israel uses against the Palestinians.” Coming during the buildup to a Feb. 19 mass demonstration in the U.S. capital where Dore will speak, this bite-size exposé is useful.
