FLOP26, Day 2: Windsor Windbags Push Depopulation; Anti-Malthusian Resistance Says, ‘The Bell Tolls for Thee!’

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—Now is the time for the movement founded by Lyndon LaRouche and headed by Helga Zepp-LaRouche to assemble a worldwide anti-Malthusian resistance. The indispensable concept to be supplied, that the LaRouche movement brings to this discussion, and without the which

there is no hope for defeating the oligarchical enemy, is the increase of available energy, per capita and square kilometer, for the whole human race, with a particular emphasis on those areas where population growth is most clearly expected in the next 50 years—the continents of Asia and Africa. Though some world leaders are now seeking to stand up to the “carbon colonialism” of the Great Reset, and the “Ghouls Gone Wild” blood-feast at Glasgow, they lack any clear sense of an alternative, and often entertain, if only to be overheard doing so, the pagan “Mother Earth” mantra, or the “carbon dioxide is a real threat” mantra. We cannot allow the degradation of the terms of the discussion into merely seeming to discuss the truth, as LaRouche discusses in his “[Riemann Refutes Euler](#)” foreword to the English translation of a collection of Riemann’s early writings.

For example, Bolivian President Luis Arce said in his COP26 speech that “developed countries are promoting a new world recolonization process that we can call the ‘new carbon colonialism,’ because they are trying to impose their own rules of the game in the climate negotiations to continue feeding the new green capitalist system, while pushing developing nations to accept these rules of the game without any other options.” True, but then what? Clearly Bolivia has defended nuclear power as a right of all people, but then, when Arce, an economist, says, in the same speech, that “The solution is to change the model of civilization and move towards an alternative model to capitalism, the concept of living well together in harmony with Mother Earth,” the flaw, and the trap, become clear.

Unless the LaRouche notion of energy flux-density, and “the increase of the rate of increase” of energy flux-density, through advanced technologies such as nuclear and thermonuclear power, is understood, mastered, and defended in its own right, no matter how militant the message of opposition to the Great Reset may sound, it will signify nothing; the same tragedy will play out. No “redistributionist” approach will outwit, for example, Lynn Rothschild’s Council for Inclusive Capitalism, which, like Bolivia’s President, calls for “an alternative view of capitalism”— though they mean something very “indifferent” than he.

We need to instantly change the terms of discourse, everywhere in the world, in unexpected ways. Consider how an alert organizer intersected Pope Francis's call for prayers for Haiti, now undergoing the dissolution of the nation, and threatening the same for the Dominican Republic. Simply by placing a link to our program for Haiti, as itself a physical-economic template for how to approach solving, not only the problem of Haiti, but the problem of many other nations in the Caribbean sector, a liberated discussion of the higher resolution became possible. The function of collaboration with nations, including China, was defined. In that sense, the Pope's call for prayer was answered: "God, help us—with our right arm."

In the Schiller Institute's Committee for the Coincidence of Opposites approach, for example, the Afghanistan situation can be seen, and organized, as a workshop for a collaboration of Russia, China, the United States and India, lessening the danger of war which is otherwise worsening virtually by the hour. It is a "win-win" military strategy of engagement, without recourse to arms and war. The "Operation Ibn Sina" world health emergency intervention is no more a mere medical or "humanitarian" idea, than Ibn Sina was merely a self-taught country physician. Consider: Ibn Sina is not only claimed as a "native son" by many areas and countries in Southwest Asia; he is also widely recognized in intellectual history as a pivotal figure in the dialogue between Islam and Christianity, and "East" and "West," because of his theological and metaphysical writings, prefiguring Nicholas of Cusa in certain respects. If one bothers to think about Arnold Toynbee's and Bernard Lewis's gnostic emphasis and predatory approach to both Islam and Christianity, and their virulent opposition to both when it comes to the question of their shared theological mandate to "increase and multiply" the human population, then the "clash of civilizations" strategy of British intelligence, including its pagan-religious side, can more easily be seen, including in their Chatham House/RIIA and Prince Charles "ecocide" and "eco-army" manifestations.

"They are neither man nor woman, they are neither brute nor human—but are pestilential carcasses disparted from their souls, called Ghouls." Prince Charles at COP26 proposed (or, more clearly, disclosed) a war on

the human race that was the “fever dream” of not only his father Philip, and Philip’s World Wildlife Fund co-founder Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands, but of the European synarchist political movements of the 1930s that had shaped both, and even the Queen, as a young child, herself. “Climate change and biodiversity loss ... pose an even greater existential threat than the COVID-19 pandemic, to the extent that we *have to* put ourselves on a war-like footing. We know what we must do. With a growing global population creating ever increasing demand on the planet’s finite resources, we have to reduce emissions urgently, and take action to tackle the carbon already in the atmosphere, including from coal-powered power systems....”

“Our efforts cannot be a series of independent initiatives running in parallel; the scale and scope of the threat we face, call for a global systems-level solution....” Sir David Attenborough, the close collaborator of Prince Philip and a central promoter of the “pre-Gaia” “natural religion” outlook more familiar to people through the work of Joseph Campbell and Carl Jung, was applauded, but not for his undiscussed views of population. They include the idea that 75% of the present *British* population is superfluous. (What’s he thinking about Africa?) Attenborough says, on the website of his organization, Population Matters: “All our environmental problems become easier to solve with fewer people, and harder—and ultimately impossible—to solve with ever more people.”

Hannibal Lecter, of “Silence of the Lambs” fame, commenting on the speeches of Attenborough and of the three Windsors (the Queen, Charles, and Philip, whose speech was in the form of the virus that people will shortly recognize they contracted during the other two speeches), said, “I may be a cannibal, but I have standards.” The world deserves better than the inedible Windsors, and COP26.

AFGHANISTAN

Afghan Authorities Set Up a Military Base in Badakhshan Province To Fight Drug Traffickers

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—According to Radio Free Europe/ Radio Liberty, Taliban officials in Badakhshan Province have confirmed that they have set up a military unit to combat drug traffic. Nisar Ahmad Ahmadi, the Taliban’s deputy governor in Badakhshan, said that they had set up a military organization to provide security in Badakhshan and fight drug trafficking. He added, “The smuggling of drugs from Badakhshan cannot be ruled out, because we have a common border [with Tajikistan] and it is possible.”

In the past, says RFE/RL, there has been a similar body in the Afghan government that has worked with the Tajik authorities to combat drug trafficking. However, with the advent of the Taliban, there are no diplomatic ties between the two countries, and it is unclear whether there is any contact or cooperation between the two sides. Afghanistan’s northern border is one of the main transit routes for drugs to Russia and Europe.

Afghanistan’s Badakhshan province, which shares a long border with Tajikistan, is one of 22 provinces in Afghanistan where opium poppy has been grown and large quantities of opium have been harvested in the past two years. This opium was processed in drug factories in the same region and turned into heroin.

ISIS-K Strikes Major Hospital in Kabul

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—The death toll had reached 25 by mid-afternoon, after multiple explosions were set off today near the entrance to Kabul’s Daoud Khan Military Hospital, located in the area where foreign diplomatic missions are located. Dozens of other casualties are reported. The hospital, with 400 beds, is one of the largest in the country, TASS reports, operated by Afghanistan’s Defense Ministry, but it also functions as a teaching

hospital, according to CNN. Afghan media are reporting that the attack—which comes in the midst of the general collapse of the nation’s health and hospital system—was carried out by the militants of the Islamic State in Khorasan.

GREEN NEW DEAL

Like Father, Like Son: Prince Charles Demands Environmentalist War Drive at COP26

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—While the Queen ensured that Prince Philip’s virus hovered visibly over the proceedings, recording her video for the Royal Family’s reception for the world leaders gathered to open COP26 with the late His Viral Highness’s picture prominently next to her, Prince Charles well saluted his father’s Nazi-like approach to depopulation, demanding that it be accomplished by replacing governments with a global system of private interests imposed through “a vast military-style campaign.”

Twice he insisted that “a war-like footing” be adopted. “Climate change and biodiversity loss ... pose an even greater existential threat than the COVID-19 pandemic, to the extent that we *have to* put ourselves on a war-like footing,” [Prince Charles](#) at the Opening Ceremony asserted from the outset. “We know what we must do. With a growing global population creating ever-increasing demand on the planet’s finite resources, we have to reduce emissions urgently and take action to tackle the carbon already in the atmosphere, including from coal-fired power stations....”

“As we tackle this crisis, our efforts cannot be a series of independent initiatives running in parallel. The scale and scope of the threat we face call for a global, systems-level solution, based on radically transforming our current fossil fuel-based economy to one that is genuinely renewable and sustainable....”

“We know this will take trillions, not billions, of dollars. We also know that countries, many of whom are burdened by growing levels of debt, simply cannot afford to “go green.” Here, we need a vast military-style campaign to marshal the strength of the global private sector. With trillions

at its disposal – far beyond global G.D.P. and, with the greatest respect, beyond even the governments of the world’s leaders – it offers the only real prospect of achieving fundamental economic transition,” he concluded.

HRH Prince Charles’s reference to a military approach is not mere metaphor. As *EIR Daily Alert* reported in its Oct. 1 issue, the British Crown’s premier policymaking think tank, the Royal Institute for International Affairs—known as Chatham House—had just published a paper, “[Building Global Climate Security](#),” arguing that since climate change poses such a serious threat to global security, it will now be necessary to rethink “traditional security concepts,” because climate change is “the most serious threat to global security we face,” and the “security community” is going to play a major role in enforcing green fascism and depopulation. For example: the Chatham House paper enthusiastically proclaimed that since there are growing calls to legally define “ecocide” as a crime under the International Criminal Court, the chance of the armed forces being called on to defend against ecocide “looks increasingly likely.”

Putin Wastes No Words on COP26

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—Russian President Putin’s participation in the COP26 conference consisted of one brief video prepared for the special panel on forest and land use, whose text was exactly 224 words long, including the requisite greetings, best wishes, and thank yous. His sole point was that because “the conservation of forests and other natural ecosystems is a key component of international efforts to address global warming and reduce emissions of greenhouse gases,” and, given that Russia accounts for around 20% of the world’s forestland, Russia will rely, among other things, on the forests’ “significant capacity to absorb carbon dioxide and produce oxygen” to reach carbon-neutrality by 2060. How? Bettering forest management, fighting illegal logging and forest fires, and expanding reforestation areas. He did add his expectation that the final document from that plan can “facilitate closer partnerships between all interested States in forest conservation.”

Biden Team in Glasgow Urges, Don't Worry About Agreements, We Have Ambitions

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—You know that President Joe Biden and team are convinced Glasgow is heading toward “FLOP26,” when they start telling all who will listen: “Glasgow must be the kickoff of a decade of ambition.... Our meeting here in Glasgow isn’t the end of the journey.... It’s really just a starting line....” (Biden to Opening Leaders Statements session). “COP26 in Glasgow is not about some new climate change agreement ... it’s about making the Paris Climate Agreement real, actually getting to the level of ambition required....” (Jake Sullivan). “Glasgow is the beginning of this decade’s race.... This is, you know, the first time we’ve gathered since Paris, with the goal of really revamping ambition in a broad way.” (John Kerry).

With nations balking at actually committing suicide as demanded, since COP26 started, the White House has been releasing new programs daily in a flurry of hand-waving to make it appear there is progress in stampeding nations into line. Were these programs to be transformed from promises into actual action, however, they would lead to the misery and death of billions.

Case in point: The formal launching today of the “Global Methane Pledge To Keep 1.5C within Reach,” by the U.S., European Union “and partners.” Leading sources of methane “emissions” identified by the Biden team: oil and gas production, agriculture, and “energy, industry, transportation and other need-to-abate sectors.” Over 100 countries have signed, committing to reduce global methane emissions by at least 30% from 2020 levels by 2030. Pledges, not binding; funding promised. Not on the list of signers: China, India, Russia.

Another case: The creation of a “Forest Investor Club,” a network of public and private financial institutions “to scale up investments” in lands around the planet limited to “sustainable agriculture and forestry,” “restored” to an alleged primitive state, etc. “The Forest Investor Club will accelerate the pace, increase the scale, and expand the scope of forest and

nature investment,” the White House wrote. Among its founding members: Apple, Conservation International, Convergence Finance, the U.S. International Development Finance Corporation, Goldman Sachs, The Nature Conservancy, the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), and the like.

Likewise: “The First Movers Coalition,” led by the State Department, John Kerry, and the billionaires’ World Economic Forum. Described as a “flagship public-private partnership ... [of] some of the largest companies in the world across a wide range of industries with hundreds of billions of dollars in purchasing power,” which are to function as “buyers’ clubs” that rig what’s available for purchase for “eight ‘need-to-abate’ sectors—steel, trucking, shipping, aviation, aluminum, concrete, chemicals, and direct air capture companies.”

Russia, China, India: Opposition at COP26

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—While Presidents Vladimir Putin and Xi Jinping did not attend the climate summit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s attending, though making clear, as TASS notes, that any increase in ambition by states like India to do more on the emissions problem, should be matched by an increase in climate finance commitments from developed nations to developing countries—to the tune of \$1 trillion.

TASS also reports that the most important subjects for Russia during these talks, according to Russian Economic Development Minister Maxim Reshetnikov, are the definition of the parameters and prospects for forest climate projects, and the recognition of nuclear energy as a “low-carbon option.”

Izvestia daily reports that Deputy Speaker of the Russian Federation Council Sen. Konstantin Kosachev observed that the Russian President’s key message was that the decisions have to be inclusive and collective. He further declared that, as Putin stated, it is important for all players in the energy market to act responsibly, based on the interests of all sides, and that it is necessary to move on to normal market relations, built exclusively on economic considerations and mutual benefit. Putin had a statement on

forestry and improved agricultural technologies, which stressed the globally relevant role of Russian forests in absorbing CO₂. It comes under the Russian argument of “climate justice” that looks at the individual countries’ specific situations, rather than imposing “one size fits all” on them.

China’s message to the summit does not contain new definite commitments, but as TASS reports reiterates President Xi’s message to the Oct. 30-31 G20 meeting in Rome: urging countries to “balance environmental protection and economic development, address climate change and safeguard people’s livelihood,” and saying that “major economies should strengthen cooperation in this regard.”

“The G20 members should take the lead in promoting and applying advanced technologies, and developed countries should also earnestly fulfil their commitments to providing funds for developing countries,” TASS quoted Xi as stating.

A detailed report on [President Xi](#)’s message was posted to the Foreign Ministry website.

U.S. Supreme Court Agrees To Hear Suit vs. EPA Free Hand To Set Power Sector Emissions

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—In an order issued late Friday, Oct. 29, the Supreme Court agreed to take up the case, *West Virginia v. EPA*, brought by 17 state Republican attorneys general and two coal companies, seeking to limit the Environmental Protection Agency’s ability to regulate greenhouse gas emissions from the electric power sector, which it calls Executive overreach.

The brief reportedly argues that the court should “intervene now,” because “how we respond to climate change is a pressing issue for our nation, yet some of the paths forward carry serious and disproportionate costs for States and countless other affected parties” (*EIR* has not yet reviewed the brief itself.)

“This is a tremendous victory for West Virginia and our nation,” West Virginia’s AG Patrick Morrisey responded to the announcement. “Given

the insurmountable costs of President Biden’s proposals, our team is eager to present West Virginia’s case as to why the Supreme Court should define the reach of EPA’s authority once and for all.” West Virginia took the lead in consolidating four prior related court cases into one for filing before the Supreme Court.

Environmental activist groups are writing of “shock waves” set off by the Court’s decision to hear the case, and their worries that rule-making against coal and other plants could be stymied by the mere acceptance of the case by the Court, even though no decision is expected until the summer.

The administration has sought to put a brave face on things, with Vice President Kamala Harris, National Climate Advisor Gina McCarthy, and EPA director Michael Regan each making statements on how “the courts have repeatedly upheld the EPA’s authority to regulate dangerous power plant pollution.” But the administration has had to resort increasingly to imposing its radical “decarbonization” measures by executive decrees of regulatory action, because the American people have not “seen the Lord” on climate change (as President Biden assured at COP26 yesterday), and therefore even the current, rotten U.S. Congress has been unable to pass the desired “decarbonization” agenda.

In covering the Supreme Court decision, *Roll Call* reminded its readers today of Deputy White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre’s Oct. 21 assertion, that “we don’t need Congress.... We can do it without Congress,” when asked how the administration plans to meet its climate goals. The legal fight could potentially scuttle that option.

CULTURAL COLLAPSE

How The Netherlands Became a Narco-State

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—The German weekly *Der Spiegel* ran an Oct. 15 cover story, “[Narco-State Netherlands: The Slippery Dutch Slope from Drug Tolerance to Drug Terror](#),” in its *Spiegel International* edition, on how the infamous Dutch drug tolerance turned into a bloody terror war.

Last July 6, investigative journalist Peter de Vries was shot down in Amsterdam. De Vries had not only reported on criminal cases, but had also solved many of them through his TV show. A one-man special commission, De Vries was, for his millions of viewers, proof that a single person could accomplish more than an entire law enforcement apparatus. The shots fired were a demonstration of who has the say in the Netherlands. An execution costs an estimated €50,000—a “package deal” that includes surveillance, an escape vehicle, a weapon, and the killer. “ ‘In the problem areas of southeastern Amsterdam, young men are queuing up to commit murder on behalf of the gangs,’ says Cees, a Dutch investigator who requested that his real name not be used in this story. ... For a long time, nobody was bothered by the fact that the country’s permissive approach to hash and marijuana had helped brutal mobsters become powerful, and that the gangs had also begun carting tons of hard drugs through the country alongside the soft ones.”

The permissive Netherlands is learning how un-free life can be in the grips of the Moroccan-dominated “Mocro gangs.” The current chief underworld boss is the Moroccan-Dutch gang leader Ridouan Taghi, arrested on Dec. 16, 2019 in Dubai, involved in at least ten murders. According to Wikipedia, documents produced by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) show what appears to be a super-drug cartel headed by Ridouan Taghi, Raffaele Imperiale (Camorra’s drugs and arms dealer), Daniel Kinahan (Irish reputed gang boss) and Edin Gačanin (Bosnian drug trafficker).

The cartel, considered by the DEA as one of the world’s top 50, was headquartered in the Burj Al Arab hotel in Dubai. The cartel has a monopoly over Peruvian cocaine, controlling around a third of the European cocaine trade. Yet, according to the DEA, shipping ports in the Netherlands are the destination for all drug shipments, increasingly the Belgian port of Antwerp.

The Taghi gang’s motto was “*Wie praat, die gaat*”—“Whoever talks must go.” Every journalist who reports about the gang, every prosecutor

who investigates them, every lawyer who represents their opponents and every witness who testifies against them. They all should be checking under their car for bombs and looking around to see who might be trailing them. They must be prepared to submit to police protection and give up their old lives, and for their family to give theirs up, too.

“All boundaries are gone,” says Cees, the investigator. Even Prime Minister Mark Rutte has supposedly fallen into the sights of the Mocro killers. People living under this constant threat don’t know when, or if it will stop. For them, there is no safety—it’s like living in a narco-state.

After Antwerp in Belgium, the port of Rotterdam is the second-largest point of entry for goods in Europe. But, *Spiegel* cites a current report from Europol and UN Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), even the drugs that arrive in Antwerp mostly go to the Netherlands, and only afterward to other countries on the continent. “Cocaine is the problem,” *Spiegel* quotes Cees as saying. “Cocaine has changed everything.”

The most recent figures available indicate that more cocaine arrived from the fields of South America in 2019 than ever before: According to the UNODC, it was 1,784 tons, double the figures in 2014. But even if more drugs are being found, to the police it just means that even more is getting through. Cocaine is flooding the market, with the UN estimating that the number of coke users in Western and Central Europe is 4.4 million. And growing.

NEW WORLD ECONOMIC ORDER

Amidst Haitian-Dominican Tensions, Schiller Institute Plan for Haiti Cracks Open Debate of ‘What Is To Be Done’

Nov. 2 (EIRNS)—As the security situation in Haiti worsens, with armed gangs continuing to prevent fuel distribution, and kidnapping and killing citizens from all walks of life, tensions between the governments of Haiti and the Dominican Republic have reached a dangerous high. Yesterday, Dominican President Luis Abinader issued an urgent tweet calling on the international community to respond to the Haitian security crisis, naming

the U.S., Canada, France, and the EU in particular, for failing to respond to cries for help. Foreign Minister Roberto Álvarez also tweeted that the President has repeatedly called for the international community to organize summits to discuss the crisis in Haiti and map out a response, to no avail. No one has responded, the daily *Listin Diario* reported him saying today. Haiti's Foreign Minister Claude Joseph, meanwhile, responded to both Abinader and Alvarez's tweets by calling on both countries to work together to deal with insecurity that affects them both, pointing to a recent State Department alert that also warned of growing crime and insecurity in the Dominican Republic. He urged Americans to exercise caution should they travel to Haiti's neighbor on the island of Hispaniola.

Tensions are intensifying, however. While 12,000 Dominican soldiers are deployed at the border with Haiti, President Abinader announced Nov. 1 that he will take a tougher stance on Haitians entering the country illegally, on enforcing existing laws, preventing women more than six months pregnant from entering the country. He threatened to deport thousands of undocumented Haitians who work in construction and agriculture. There is a good deal of fear-mongering from the Dominican side that Haitian gangs may try to invade the country, leading the former head of the Army, Jorge Radhames Zorrilla, and the organization of retired generals and admirals to offer their services to help "defend national sovereignty."

It is noteworthy that in the midst of this tense situation, the Schiller Institute's Plan for the Development of Haiti, whose English-, Spanish-, and French-language editions have circulated widely throughout Ibero-America and the Caribbean, including in both the Dominican Republic and Haiti, has set off something of a firestorm in the Twittersphere, changing the terms of the conversation. After [Pope Francis](#) issued a tweet Oct. 31 (@Pontifex_es) calling on people to pray for Haiti and urging the international community not to abandon it, and a [Schiller Institute](#) organizer responded that the mission established by Lyndon LaRouche after the 2010 earthquake "can and must be carried out, including with China, to lift Haiti out of its overwhelming poverty and convert it to an economic development

model for the Western Hemisphere and the world,” and included the link to the Spanish-language program.

It set off a series of tweets from people from many different countries around the region, as far south as Argentina, including elected officials, lawyers, church officials, and academics, all commenting or making proposals on how to proceed, taking off from the Schiller organizer’s remarks. It included attacking the U.S. for its years of military invasions and imposing neoliberalism on Haiti. The Argentine respondent observed that the Schiller proposal “is a good one,” but added that Haiti’s location unfortunately “makes it politically conditioned by the U.S.” The Schiller organizer pointed out to one tweeter that the program for Haiti is, in fact, a comprehensive program that can be applied to any country of the region, taking into account national differences, but starting from the standpoint that what’s needed is a “new paradigm of international relations.”
